QUERY

Ask yourself about each section.

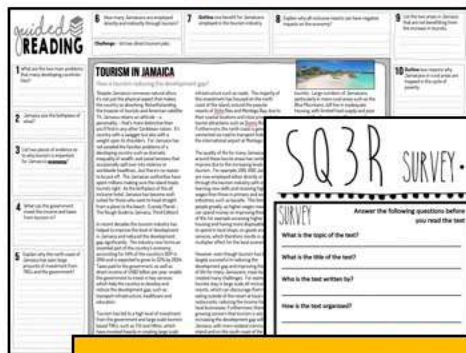

Using Sora to Support Learning

Definitions, Highlights and Notes in Sora

- Use the Sora app to assign a text to your class
- Ask them to highlight and define words that they don't understand (this will save in each pupil's app and can also be downloaded)
- Ask pupils to export the defined words lists and use them to write their own sentences

Changing the Page to Suit Pupils' Needs

- Pressing the 'A' in the top right hand corner of the page brings up options to change the appearance of the text.
- The background and font size can be adapted to make it easier to read.

Read-Alongs in Sora

- Find read-along books in Sora (see how to image)
- Read-alongs have narration so pupils can follow the text as it's being read
- Perfect to support SEN and MFL pupils (Spanish authentic texts)

You can also search for read-alongs

1. Click on top Q
2. Select More options
3. Choose the Read-alongs option. If you're not sure you can click on other search options too.
4. Select Search

Assigning Books - Tasks

- It is possible to assign certain texts for your classes to read, then set comprehension questions based on sections of the text or chapters to check their understanding (ask Dawn for help to do this)
- Set tasks for pupils to find, summarise, analyse or interpret a section/chapter of the text

Skimming and Scanning

- When you're reading, you don't have to read everything with the same amount of care and attention. Sometimes you need to be able to **read a text very quickly**.
- **Skimming and scanning** are both quick reading techniques but they have different purposes.

skim

read or look over something quickly to get an idea

scan

look quickly for a certain word or phrase

Skimming

Ask pupils to **skim** read a text for the gist, then give a brief summary of the information given. Pupils should identify the **main ideas** in the text.

Scanning

Ask pupils to **scan** a text to find **specific information**. Ask them find specific information quickly to answer questions about information in the text.

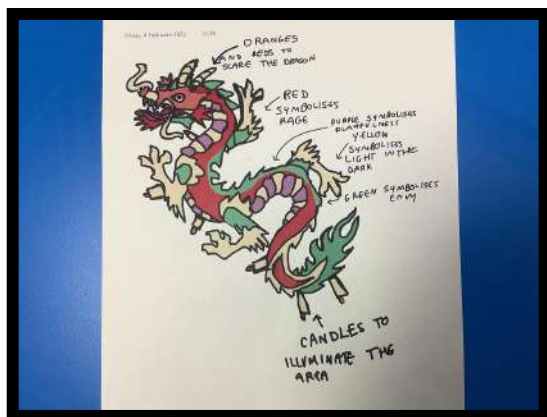
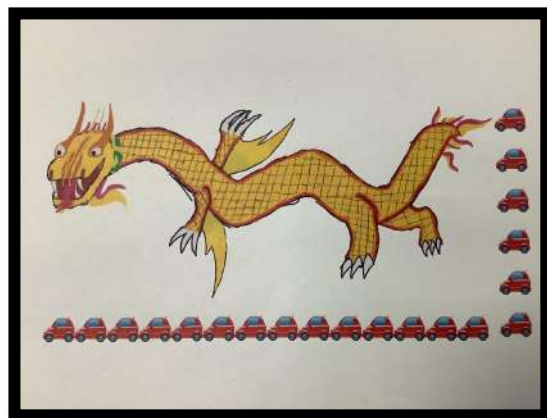
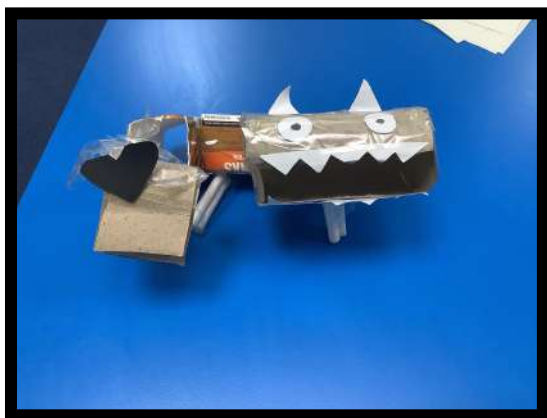
THE CHINESE DRAGON COMPETITION

Three rare diseases you never knew existed

Stoneman Syndrome. Frequency: one in two million people. ...

Painful soft tissue nodules/masses around head and neck with torticollis (twisting of the neck) are the earliest symptoms. They are followed by hard soft tissue swelling and ossifications of other parts of body. These may lead to restricted movement and deformities depending on the extent of involvement.

Alice In Wonderland Syndrome (AIWS) Frequency: currently unknown. ...

is a **rare neurological disorder characterized by distortions of visual perception, the body image, and the experience of time.** People may see things smaller than they are, feel their body alter in size or experience any of the syndrome's numerous other symptoms.

Chronic Focal Encephalitis (Rasmussen's Encephalitis)

Rasmussen's encephalitis (RE) is a **very rare, chronic inflammatory neurological disease** that usually affects only one hemisphere (half) of the brain. It most often occurs in children under the age of 10 but can also affect adolescents and adults.
