6. The number magic trick

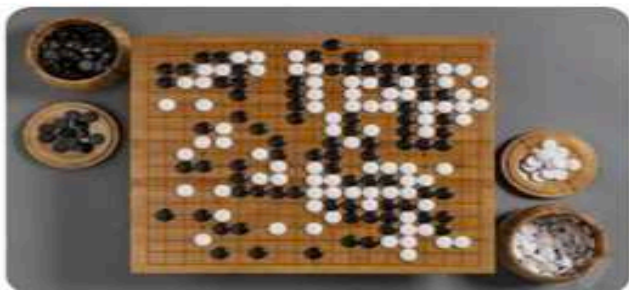
How to do the trick:

1. Tell your audience to think of a number from 1 to 9. If you have an adult audience, give them bigger numbers.
2. Your audience will not tell you the number they thought of.
3. Ask them to multiply that number by 2.
4. Then, multiply the result by 5.
5. Now let them reveal the result of their multiplication.
6. Drop the zero from that answer and tell them what their number was.
7. For example: If the number is 6, your audience will do:
 $6 \times 2 = 12$, $12 \times 5 = 60$. From 60, drop the zero and their **number is 6**.

Go is the oldest game in the world that is still played in its original form. It is thought to be at least 3000 years old.

Go is so complex that a game played on a 19 x 19 grid contains more possible moves than there are atoms in the observable universe. It is advisable to start playing on a smaller board! The object of Go is to surround more territory than the opponent by the strategic placement of stones. Go is easy to learn – but very difficult to master.

REVISE How To Revise/Recap

- Summarise**
 - Read a topic/chapter/page and summarise into 5 bullet points.
- 5 Questions**
 - Read the topic/chapter/page and write your own 5 questions with answers.
- Definitions**
 - Pick 5 keywords and write the meaning.
- Picture**
 - Draw a diagram/picture and label it to explain what it shows
- Video**
 - Watch a SHORT video on YouTube on a topic/keyword/concept and pause it at appropriate times to make 5 bullet points.
- Quiz**
 - Find 10 questions on kahoot, booklet or educake, answer them and make notes on anything you learn or need to remember.
- Mind Map**
 - Pick a topic and draw a mind map explaining 10 key points.
- Copy**
 - Pick a topic and read the crucial knowledge.
Copy 5 sentences that you don't remember or understand.
- Memory**
 - Look at the crucial knowledge for 30 seconds. Cover it up and write down everything you can remember in 30 seconds. Repeat 3 times.
- Flash Card**
 - Pick a topic/chapter/page and on the front of the flash card write 5 keywords/phrases or pictures and on the back write what they mean.
- Exam Questions/Past Papers**
 - Pick a topic and answer exam questions. Ensure you use a mark scheme to check your answers. Past Papers can be found online and downloaded.
- Worksheets/Workbooks**
 - Pick a topic and complete a placemat or worksheet on that topic. Ask your teacher and they will print/send you lots. Use your memory first and then use other resources such as the crucial knowledge to help you.

Revision Strategies

Brain Dump

Choose a topic and write down as much as you can remember, without referring to your notes. Check your notes and see what you missed then try fill the gaps without the notes. Check your notes a third time and add the missing information.

Flash Cards

Write flash cards for each topic, in all subjects, then mix them up for the most effective revision. Check out the Leitner System for effective spacing and interleaving. Keep your flash cards simple – one question, one answer per card.

Map it out

Take an essay question or writing question and map out your answer, without writing a full response. Look at the mark scheme and decide if you plan meets the criteria. DO this for a number of questions, then choose one and write the full response.

Past Papers

Ask your teacher for practice questions or exam papers or find them on the exam board website. Complete them without notes in the exam conditions, then check your answers and identify the gaps in your knowledge, so you can target your revision.

Quizzes

Write a set of questions and answers and ask someone to test you. Its important to either write or say your answers loud. Reading through quizzes in your head can give you a false sense of security.

Thinking Hard: Reduce

Read a section of your notes then put them aside and reduce what you need into 3 bullet points, each one no more than 10 words. Look back at the notes and decide if you missed anything important. Hide the notes and write a fourth bullet point.

Practice Introductions

For essay subjects, take a past exam question and practice writing effective introductions and conclusion. Look back at your notes and remind yourself of the important things to remember. Practice for different topics, texts and papers.

Thinking Hard: Connect

For each subject, consider the exam paper and group together questions that require the same technique to answer. Write down the requirements for each type. Find a previous example you have completed and identify where you've met the criteria.

Thinking Hard: Transform

Read a paragraph from your notes or a text book, and transform it into a diagram, chart or sketch – no words allowed. OR Look a diagram in science, for example, and transform it into a paragraph of explanation.

Key Vocabulary

For a particular topic, make a list of key vocabulary, then do the following: define each word; use each term in a sentence; create a question where the key word is the answer; identify other words which connect to each of the words in your list.

Harmony. Definition- agreement; accord; harmonious relations. a consistent, orderly, or pleasing arrangement of parts.

In Life	Harmony is a necessary condition for development, progress, fulfilment, overall happiness and survival of both the individual and the group to which he or she belongs to. It unites people in spite of their diversity and prevents enmity, wars and conflicts
Citizenship	Fundamental British Values underpin what it is to be a citizen in a modern and diverse Great Britain with the aim of creating and maintaining a harmonious society. These values are Democracy, Rule of Law, Respect and Tolerance, Individual Liberty.
With Nature	The term "Harmony with Nature" refers to a principle of amicable and holistic co-existence between humanity and nature. It is used in several contexts, most prominently in relation to sustainable development and the rights of nature, both aimed at addressing the impacts of mankind and a number of environmental crises.
Poetry and Prose	In Literature harmony can mean the overall style of a piece, or in the relationship between the sounds and words and the topic of the thought. For example, this might mean not using harsh words to talk about gentle things, or using pleasant words for hard and unpleasant things.
Music	In music, harmony is the process by which individual sounds are joined together or composed into whole units or compositions. Often, the term harmony refers to simultaneously occurring frequencies, pitches (tones, notes), or chords.
Art	Harmony is a principle of art that refers to how well the visual elements of a piece of art work together. It includes the use and choice of colours, shape, value (light and dark), brushwork, style and subject.
Science	Science influences society through its knowledge and world view. It influences the way many individuals in society think about themselves, others, and the environment. The effect of science on society is neither entirely beneficial (harmonious) nor entirely detrimental (devisive).
Religion	Religions are meant to promote peace and harmony in our society. Religious tolerance is a human rights issue extending religious freedom to people of all faiths and traditions without any discrimination.
