

Ira was the **first black** actor to play major Shakespearean parts. He won acclaim as Othello and for many other roles such as King Lear, Shylock, **Macbeth** and Hamlet. Ira was born in **New York**, 1807. Ira arrived in the UK by **1825** and quickly started to find acting work. In 1863 he became a **British citizen.** He died whilst on tour in Poland in 1867.

An interview with Mr Whitehead (senior)

'Laying down the Law'

Why did you become a lawyer?

At **university** I did a non-law degree and went to the Careers advisers to discuss options. They recommended the law on the basis of my interests.

What type of law did you do?

I started with **criminal law** advising and representing people in court, preparing cases for **barristers** to present in the Crown Court. Over the years I worked in:

Personal injury
Matrimonial (marriage & divorce)
Probate (dealing with wills)
Company & commercial property
Housing and antisocial behaviour law.

What are the main types of lawyer?

•Solicitors – work in legal practices or for big companies and do a wide variety of work

•Barristers – work in 'chambers' and spent a lot of time in court with wigs & gowns

•Legal Executives - legally qualified and can do some work independently

•Paralegals – not always qualified but help out other lawyers

Any advice you'd give to an aspiring lawyer?

Be prepared for long hours and challenging work, the law is complex and often obscure
You need a good understanding of English to clearly express concepts and thought
You will be held to the highest possible standards of behaviour and competence
Many clients come to you in great distress and you must be able to empathise
Be aware that you cannot fix" everything" for clients.

What qualifications would you recommend?

A good understanding of English is needed as you will need to persuade people of your argument.
Skills that may be learned or improved by training in the performing arts, formally or via "Am Dram"

•A law **degree** is the usual but not only entry route. Consider the legal executive training courses or paralegal courses.

•Legal apprenticeships now offer another route and often combine business skills with learning the law.
