






Diwali Festival

What's the worst thing about your job?


Thinking no matter what I do there are some occasions **that I can't make someone** better no matter how hard I try.

What other jobs have you done?

Worked in a **doctors receptionist** when I was 16 for a year then went into **nurse training** at the age of 18. within the role of **psychiatric** nurse I have had other roles other than liaison, I have been a community psychiatric nurse, worked on an acute admissions ward, a bedded resource centre to include relaxation therapy and groupwork.

If you could choose another career, what would it be? A Health visitor, I have enjoyed working with new mums who are having difficulties coping with mental health issues before during and after pregnancy.

What were you best at when you were at school? PE, I was in all the school teams.

What course options would you recommend for someone to get into that role?

Health and Social care, Science, Psychology, English and Maths at school. At **FE college** I would say Health and Social **level 3**, Psychology and Sociology, Biology. Then you will need a **nursing degree**.

What three attributes would someone need to be a nurse?

Patience, resilience and sense of humour.



- The right to be protected from danger

- •The right to live in a productive environment
- •The right to be cared for in the absence of a parent or guardian

•The right to good governance (a political system that inspires them to become an active citizen)

The right to freedom and peace
