**What was your first ever job?**

Woolworths on the till, a **Saturday job**.

**What is your current job title?**

Clinical Lead in liaison **psychiatry**. Liaison psychiatry is **hospital based** where we see patients who come into A&E and those on the wards within the hospital

**What would your average day be like?**

There isn't an average day, **every day is different**. You never know what to expect and should never have any **expectations**.

**What's the best thing about your job?**

Being able to **make a difference** to peoples lives, and even sometimes save their lives. Knowing I have helped someone **to feel better** gives me satisfaction

**What's the worst thing about your job?**

Thinking no matter what I do there are some occasions **that I can't make someone** better no matter how hard I try.

**Is your job satisfying?**

Yes



**What other jobs have you done?**

Worked in a **doctors receptionist** when I was 16 for a year then went into **nurse training** at the age of 18. within the role of **psychiatric nurse** I have had other roles other than liaison, I have been a community psychiatric nurse, worked on an acute admissions ward, a bedded resource centre to include relaxation therapy and groupwork.

**If you could choose another career, what would it be?**

A **Health visitor**, I have enjoyed working with new mums who are having difficulties coping with **mental health** issues before during and after **pregnancy**.

**What were you best at when you were at school?**

PE, I was in all the school teams.

**What course options would you recommend for someone to get into that role?**

Health and Social care, Science, Psychology, English and Maths at school. At **FE college** I would say Health and Social **level 3**, Psychology and Sociology, Biology. Then you will need a **nursing degree**.

**What three attributes would someone need to be a nurse?**

Patience, resilience and sense of humour.

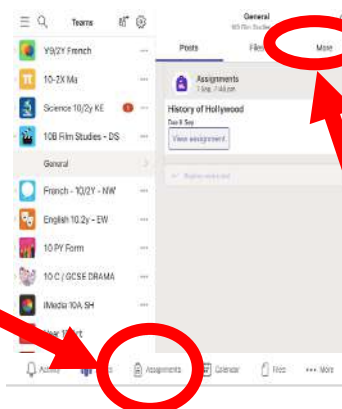

World Children's Day was first established in 1954 to promote international togetherness, awareness among children worldwide, and improving children's welfare.

### **The 12 rights of children:**

- The right to be born well (proper medical attention)
- The right to a wholesome family life
- The right to be raised well and become contributing members of society
- The right to basic needs (food/clothing/shelter/healthcare)
- The right to access what they need to have a good life
- The right to education
- The right to play and enjoy their youth
- The right to be protected from danger

- The right to live in a productive environment
- The right to be cared for in the absence of a parent or guardian
- The right to good governance (a political system that inspires them to become an active citizen)
- The right to freedom and peace

Globally an estimated **800 MILLION CHILDREN** live in fragile and conflicted areas where child rights are often denied and childhoods are stolen by abuse, exploitation and slavery. (World Vision:2020)
