





What was your first ever job?

Police Officer-Metropolitan Police-joined the Met cadets at 18 and moved to the Full Police at 19 (cadets no longer exist as an entry route-Most forces have volunteer cadets). I had done some temporary jobs at Wedgwoods during school holidays but joined the Police cadets on completing A Levels at 18.

What is your current job title?

I have just retired as **Police Constable** on the response teams at Hanley-Staffs Police. I have been with Staffs Police for last few years having spent all my career and life in London.

Which did you prefer The Metropolitan Police or Staffs?

Both very different and enjoyed both-hand on heart though the Met-It has given me a fantastic career in a fantastic city (I love London) and I have met some great people over the years. METROPOLITAN

What roles can you specialise in in the police?

There are numerous roles. You have to do a 2 year probationary period-although it slightly varies from force to force after that you can specialise in things such as -Dogs,

Firearms, CID, Public Order, Major investigation teams, Mounted branch, Diving, River Police, child protection, Traffic and many many more.



What roles have you had?

I started like everyone on a **response shift** at a busy central London area. I moved on to Public Order roles where I loved the work and you had to be physically fit before moving to a **Firearms role**. I spent many years on the firearms teams and then became a firearms and Close Protection instructor where I taught people to shoot and the tactics involved in both roles.

What would your average day be like?

There isn't an average day, every day is different and every role is different. You never know what to expect and that is why I have enjoyed policing so much-you should never have any expectations other than EVERYONE TRIES THEIR BEST.

What's the best thing about your job?

Being able to make a difference to a situation and feeling that you have actually helped and even sometimes save their lives

What has been your most enjoyable role and why?

All the roles involved with my **firearms**. Dealing with firearms incidents does make you feel as though you have made a real difference-Yes I have been involved in some high profile incidents of which I am very proud and wouldn't have been able to have that experience without a career in the Police.

The Olympics was very special in London. I was a Close Protection officer at the time providing protection to UK based and overseas royals and foreign leaders. I love my sport and was lucky enough to see



most of the Olympic events whilst providing this protection. A once in a lifetime opportunity (literally).

Q&A Jez Statham

(Mr Farrs Besty) Policeman, Firearms officer & **Close Protection Officer**



What's the worst thing about your job?

Sometimes no matter how hard you try then you cannot help or make a difference- it is the fact that you TRY YOUR BEST AND GIVE 100% EVERY TIME

Is your job satisfying?

Yes, it is very different now to when I joined but the principles remain the same in that you want to help people. I wouldn't change a thing, its like anything in life, you get out of it what you put into it.

What other jobs have you done?

Delivered papers as soon as I was old enough. I always wanted to have my own money. I worked as a seasonal labourer on the Wedgwood estate during school summer holidays. I now have a business as an Endurance sports coach (specializing in Triathlon) which is part time and runs along side my other jobs. I coach and train adults to compete in Triathlons and am Junior coach

at Newcastle (Staffs) Triathlon club.

If you could choose another career, what would it be? A

Professional golfer. I love sport and love travel. I was good at golf as a junior and so this would have been a dream career.

What were you best at when you were at school?

P.E. I tried every sport going and I think PE helps you problem solve. I was also good at English, Geography and History. I was lucky in that I had some excellent and inspiring teachers. (Marshlands High School at the time, Wolstanton High Now, although I believe it has changed its name again). I enjoyed Maths but it didn't come easy, I managed a pass with the help of some great teachers.

What course options would you recommend for someone to get into that role?

The entry requirements often change depending on demand and where policing sits politically. You often have to sit an entrance exam which tests Maths and English. No matter how the entry requirements change Maths and English appear to be consistent.

What three attributes would someone need to be a Police Officer?

(Lots LOL) Determination, Patience and resilience (A sense of humour is a must).
