



What would you say your role is?

I work in a **hospital** and support adults who are being **abused** by their current partners, ex-partners or family members.

What would your average day be like?

It varies a lot. I speak to people who attend A&E after being assaulted, I complete risk assessments, safety plans and offer advice and practical support. I work quite closely with a lot of different agencies - Police, Adult & Children's Social Care, GP's, Schools, Housing, Mental Health, Drug & Alcohol support agencies. I attend meetings and also deliver domestic abuse training to other staff members. I attend court with people and sometimes have to give evidence in court and provide statements to the Police.

What's the best thing about your job?

I love the variety, I meet interesting people, I feel like I'm helping people. I really like attending Court.

Good communicator, Integrity and Empathy


