Mr Powell's Book Recommendations!



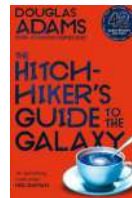
"Things to Make and Do in the Fourth Dimension" by Matt Parker. Matt Parker is an Australian comedian who used to teach Math. As a result, he speaks openly about how boring Maths education can be. In his series of books, he revisits simple concepts that all teenagers remember from school through a series of real-life historical applications, games and puzzles and almost random uses that invite the reader to question everyday practices. This isn't a textbook, it's a conversation about why pirates argued about the best type of pyramid to stack their cannonballs in, about why your cutting your pizzas incorrectly, and why NASA hide a document containing the first 10 million digits of $\sqrt{2}$ on their website. See also "Humble Pi: A comedy of Math Errors" by the same author.

The HitchHiker's Guide to the Galaxy.

Here are a couple of books Miss Owen loved as a child (She can't narrow it down to one, these books were both important to Miss Owen!) The Bronte's are still a much loved favourite, the Bronte Parsonage Museum at Haworth is a must for any avid fan.

Running CCSC School Library for 17 years has given me access to so many brilliant teenage novels it is really difficult to narrow them down, but the books that have made a lasting impression on me are, Harry Potter by JK Rowling, His Dark Materials Trilogy by Phillip Pullman, Looking For JJ by Anne Cassidy, Private Peaceful by Michael Morpurgo and Rani & Sukh by Bali Rai. Above all others though is *Noughts & Crosses* by Malorie Blackman, a novel that everyone should read and one that I keep going back to time and time again. The most recent, *Crossfire* is centred around current UK and world politics.

I have just started to read *Concrete Rose* by Angie Thomas, the prequel to her phenomenal debut novel *The Hate U Give*. Angie Thomas and Patrice Lawrence are two recent exciting new talents in the YA book market.

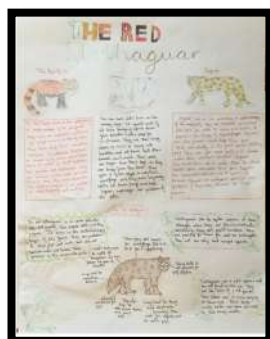

Is it just in 'the trades' like building and joinery?

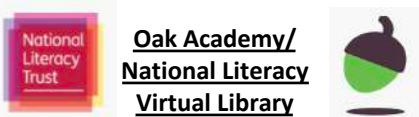
No. There are loads of places that do apprenticeships – here are some examples of Apprenticeships that Newcastle College recently advertised:

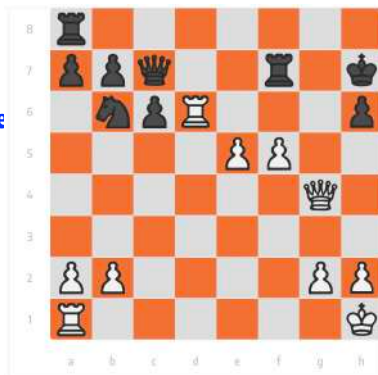
