



#### Mr Kennerley's Recommendations!



#### Mr Dunn's Recommendations



I left CCSC in July 2011 and started at Newcastle-under-Lyme College on A-Levels (Biology, PE, Psychology and Geography). After a year I decided I did not enjoy A Levels so started on BTEC Sports and Exercise Science which I loved and ended the course with D\*D\*D\*. I was accepted to my dream uni at University of Birmingham where I studied Sport, PE and Coaching Science BSc and graduated in 2017. I then decided to have a break from education and spent two years working as an activity coordinator at a library and as an admin assistant, these jobs only made me realise that the only career I wanted was to be a teacher. I started my PGCE in Post Compulsory Education at University of Wolverhampton in Sept 2019. I am now teaching 3 days at City of Wolverhampton College as a BTEC Sports Lecturer and studying my Masters in Lifelong Education alongside this.

I was always really nervous about leaving school because I enjoyed the experience and felt comfortable in my little bubble. I also had a really strict plan for how I wanted life to go. I.e. School – College – University – Teaching with no breaks or issues. Things didn't go to plan (such as not enjoying A Levels and taking a break after university) and at the time this seemed like the end of the world and almost like I'd failed myself for not achieving what I expected by a certain date. Now when I look back, I'm grateful for the way things turned out and I'm happy it took me a little longer than expected to start my career, because I actually feel ready. So sometimes I wish I could go back and reassure myself that things would turn out okay and to not stress so much about following a plan.




