Hello! My name is Cole \& I went to CCSC between 2006 \& 2011, so not quite when they still used blackboards but still before the invention of an iPad!

Since leaving school, I have pursued a career in performing arts, more specifically musical theatre. This is a career I have a huge passion for \& hopefully some of you do too, it's also a passion that was nurtured brilliantly while I was at school.

At school I enjoyed a variety of different extra-curricular activities including being captain of the school football team and playing rugby \& basketball. Performing arts was, however, where most of my fun memories at school were made.

The lovely Miss Owen \& Miss Flav were fantastic at letting me explore my creative side through the school musicals, talent shows \& even let myself \& my (still best friend to this day) Martyn, put on our own charity comedy event for Comic Relief.

My GCSE options included Music \& Drama \& those subject choices then helped me secure a place at 'Jill Clewes' Academy for Theatre Arts' to take my BTEC. This is a great place if you are interested in theatre and lots of pupils from CCSC have gone on to train there since I did. The course focuses on practical training to help students gain places at accredited dance \& drama schools to study higher education.

They also help students who don't want to go directly down the drama school then university route and really help to build your self-confidence. It also puts on fantastic shows, classes and the social life is great! Before I started, I hadn't danced a day in my life but by the time I moved to London, I was confident in ballet, tap, jazz, musical theatre, voice, acting \& singing and was ready to make the move to higher education.

There are lots of drama schools to choose from (some you can start at 16 but for others you need to be 18) and getting in is often a difficult process, you have to apply \& pay for each audition, travel to auditions, go for recalls etc and schools are very popular. If you've got the passion, drive \& talent then this shouldn't put you off but make sure to pick the one that's right for you!

I trained at a school called Laine Theatre Arts, where Victoria Beckham went many moons ago, \& tried to perfect my craft there. The best thing any teacher ever said to me there is that a career as a performer is made up of 'high highs \& low lows' No performer is ever completely in work and I've done lots of jobs just to keep my head above water but when you are performing, I promise it makes it all worth it!

Since leaving l've performed on cruise ships, stages across the country, pantomimes, adverts \& I'm now currently doing the musical Starlight Express in Germany (in the German language so listen harder in MFL than I did \& it may come in even more useful in your later years). In the future I hope to do a show that tours to The Regent Theatre in Stoke $\&$ invite the entire school along, as I wouldn't be anywhere near where I am today without the patience of the performing arts staff at CCSC!

With determination \& passion for the arts then you will already have what it takes to forge a career in the same industry as me \& I would love to see more performers coming out of areas like Chesterton, Wolstanton, Bradwell \& Crackley to name a few.

## Was a national public holiday from 1660-1859, some rural areas still celebrate it.

Charles came to the throne in 1625 . Relations between Charles I and Parliament gradually got worse. There were clashes about foreign policy and many Puritan Protestants disliked Charles' religious policy. Charles married a French Catholic against the wishes of Parliament. Charles revived old laws and taxes without the agreement of Parliament. When Parliament complained in 1629, he dismissed them. Until 1640, Charles ruled without a Parliament - this period is often referred to as the 'Eleven Years Tyranny'.

Civil war, Charles' execution and England as a republic. Parliament had the support of the south-east of England, merchants, London and the navy. Charles' forces were gradually worn down. After Oliver Cromwell set up the New Model Army, Parliament won decisive victories at Marston Moor (1644) and Naseby (1645). Charles surrendered in 1646. He failed a second time to defeat Parliament during the Second Civil War in 1648. Parliament put him on trial for treason and he was executed in 1649.

The restoration of Charles II. The Civil War, however, achieved no permanent change in the balance of power between king and Parliament. In 1660, his son Charles II was restored to the throne and continued, as his father had done, trying to rule without Parliament. It became the custom for supporters of the monarchy to wear oak leaves with an apple (gall) attached on Oak Apple Day the day of the king's restoration.
