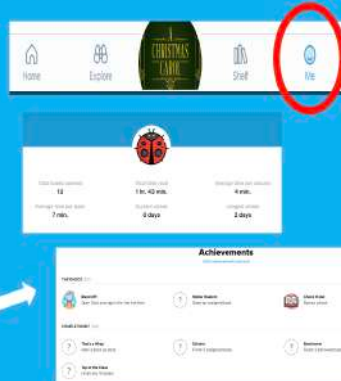

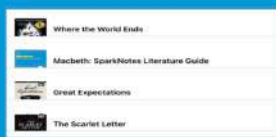

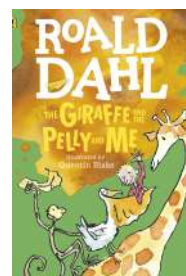

My favourite book as a kid was Roald Dahl's the giraffe the pelly and me. Very fun small easy book ready to read over and over again.

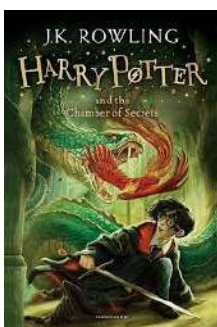

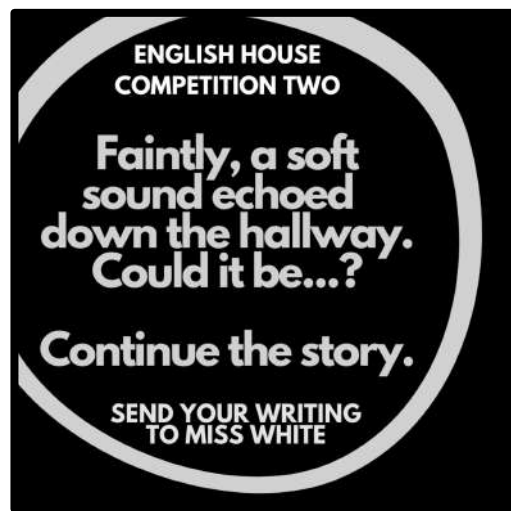
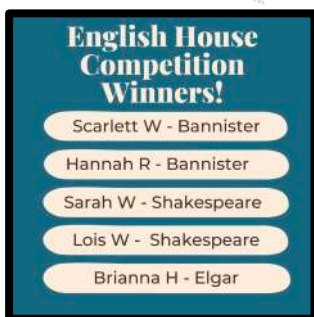
The Hunger Games: I have read the first book and I recently was recommended them again. I completely forgot about them, so I have started to read them again. I would recommend to anyone my age.

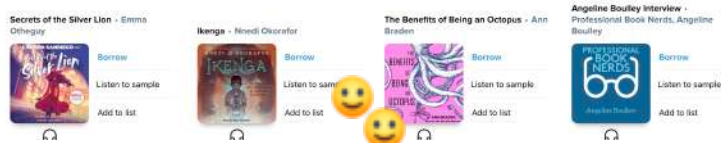
Our favourite book is Midnight library an easy read with short compelling chapters that make you want to read on. You see how small choices in life really do change your path for the future.
