





So you're thinking about becoming an Electrician?

Experience needed: Good news!!.... there is no minimum requirements or experience needed to train as an electrician.

Lots of jobs available: there is a growing shortage of electricians in the UK.

Qualifications: Having decent GCSEs in English, Maths, Physics and ICT is a distinct advantage and if you don't you'll have to take an aptitude test.

Other requirements: You'll also have to take a vision and colour assessment — confusing different coloured wires is a bad idea!

How to become an electrician - normally an apprenticeship and going to college at the same time, learning on the job.

How much could I earn? - £21,000 as a trainee going up to £30-40,000 when qualified

Best part of the job? - Lots of variety in the work.

Worst part of the job? - a physical job that often requires travelling to different places.
