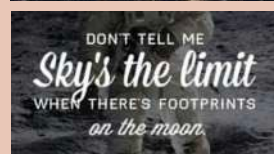
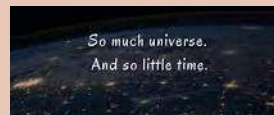


The "x" in the photograph opposite shows where the Apollo 11 mission landed near the southern edges of the Sea of Tranquility. This was the spaceflight that first landed humans on the Moon. Commander Neil Armstrong and lunar module pilot Buzz Aldrin formed the American crew that landed the Apollo Lunar Module Eagle on July 20, 1969.

Nasa is currently getting ready to explore more of the Moon as part of the Artemis program and the agency has selected SpaceX to continue development of the first commercial lander that will safely carry the next two American astronauts to the lunar surface.

At least one of these astronauts will make history as the first woman on the Moon. Another goal of the Artemis program includes landing the first person of colour on the lunar surface.

It was planned that the landing would take place in 2024 but this is expected to be delayed due to problems with the manufacture of their spacesuits.
