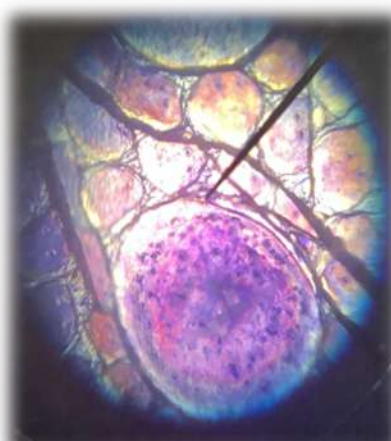

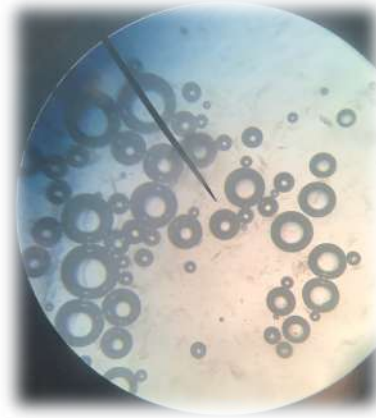

KDR: Harvey Jefferson Y10 for volunteering to read every lesson; he has been outstanding as Mr Birling

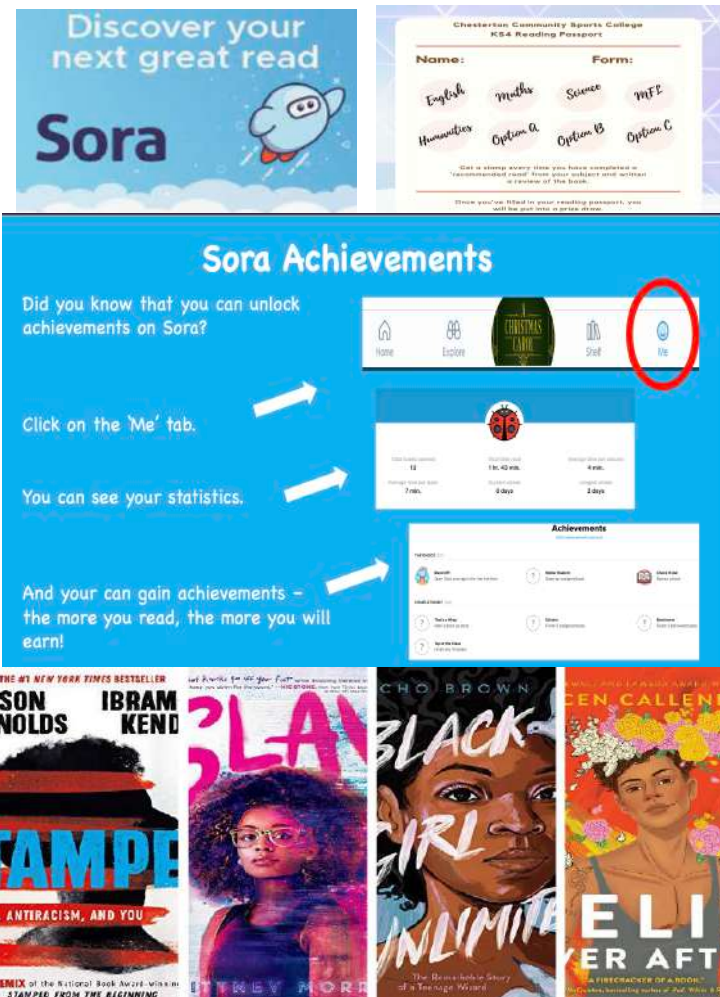
EW: Nathan Taylor-Wade Y8 for his fantastic effort and attitude to learning in his English lessons

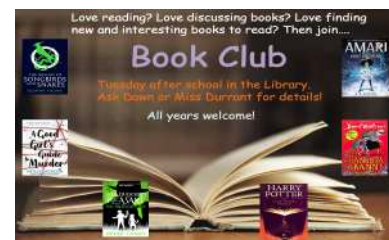

October is Black History Month. This national celebration aims to promote and celebrate Black contributions to British society, and to foster an understanding of Black history in general.

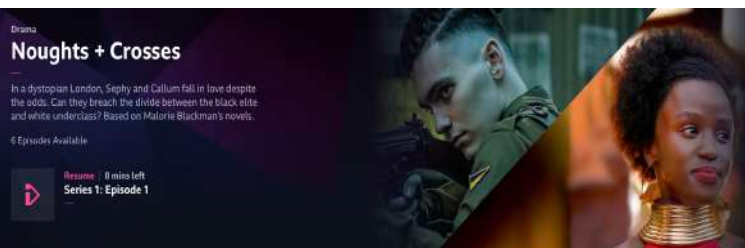
Its origins began in the 1920s.

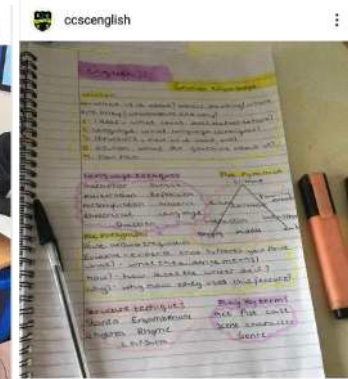

This weekend, Year 10 History Club pupils had an over night stay at the University of Wales, Aberystwyth to gain a taste of University life and receive specific lectures on the history of disability in the Middle Ages (focusing on the causes and types of disability as well as attempts to cure disability with things such as prosthetics) and the role of Edward Jenner in the creation of the smallpox vaccine and its long-lasting affects. Both of these topics will be useful to these pupils who are studying the history of medicine at GCSE. Dr Gillibrand was incredibly impressed with the knowledge and ability to apply it of all pupils. Pupils also experienced a campus tour, talked to current and former students about life at university and visited the town of Aberystwyth also.

All pupils had a great time and were perfectly behaved! We look forward to visiting again with some more of our pupils!



Y8 RAF Cosford

Year 8 pupils had the chance to visit RAF Cosford as part of a STEM activity. They witnessed forces at work within different engineering and scientific concepts. As well as taking in the marvels of the fantastic array of aircraft, they visited the pop up attractions such as robotic programming, paper aircraft throwing competition (won by Harry Lea) and other STEM within real life context, stalls. We then watched Reece in the 'Think Tank Show' which was centred around Tim Peakes' visit to space. A fantastic day with perfectly behaved pupils.

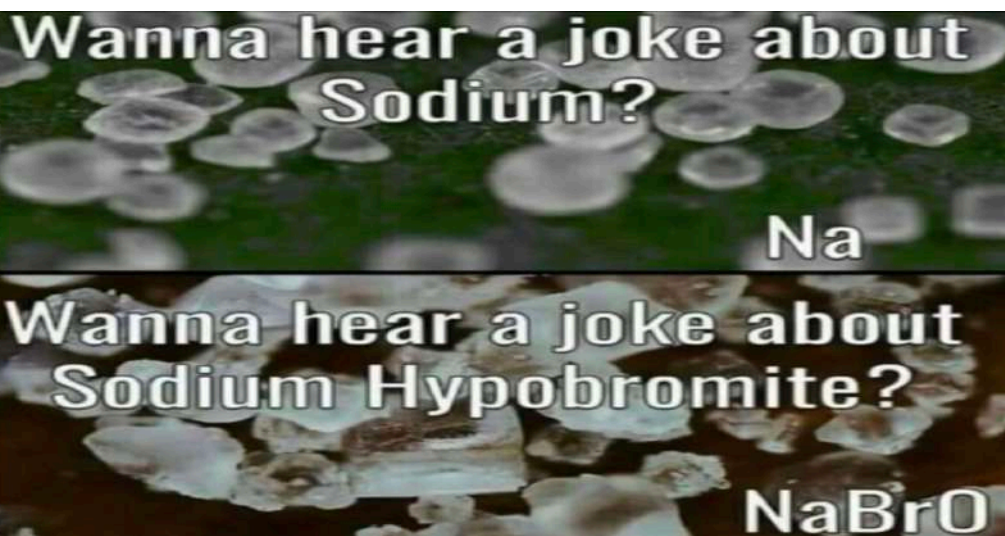
