



Fisher and Kings Academy on Thursday



# Bilal bin Rabah

From tortured slave to leader of a community

"An Arab has no superiority over a non-Arab nor a non-Arab has any superiority over an Arab; also a white person has no superiority over a black person, nor a black person has any superiority over white person, except by faith and good action"

Prophet Muhammad



Allah (God) in Arabic



The Ka'bah in Makkah. Arabia, where Bilal was the first Muslim ever to make the call to prayer

Bilal bin Rabah was an African slave who lived in Makkah, Arabia at the time of the Prophet Muhammad (founder of Islam) in the 7th century.

- He became one of the first seven people to become a Muslim this was against the wishes of his slavemaster who wanted Bilal to worship idols and statues, instead of Allah (God).
- Bilal was ridiculed and persecuted and made to lie on burning coals, had rocks placed on his chest and dragged through the streets, yet he refused to give up his beliefs and remained strong in his faith.
- He left his home in Makkah along with other Muslims when it became too dangerous to stay there.
- When thousands of Muslims returned to Makkah a few years later, Bilal was made a leader and amazingly forgave all those who had tortured him despite the scars left on his body and mind from their cruel treatment.
- Bilal was given great respect and honour by the Prophet Muhammad who appointed him the first muezzin (person who makes the call to Muslim prayer). His beautiful voice became well known in most of Arabia.
- The example and sacrifices of people like Bilal led to Islam spreading to many countries to become one of the world's great religions. Therefore, he is a huge inspiration for all Muslims who remember him with great love, admiration and respect.









#### Anti-slavery day- 18th October

The Salvation Army has held the government contract to provide specialist support to adult victims of modern slavery in England and Wales since 2011. In that time, the organisation has supported more than 12,500 people through safe accommodation, outreach support and specialist services.

Although the total annual number of victims in the UK are small from figures in their 2020 Report of the 243 British modern slavery victims.

111 were coerced into criminal exploitation, 70 were victims of forced labour, 46 were forced into sexual exploitation, 9 were trapped in domestic servitude and 40% of all victims were aged between 18 and 25.

Criminal exploitation accounted for 11% of cases and included forced begging, financial exploitation and drug dealing. For the third year running forced labour, which includes working in industries such as farming and factories, continues to be the most common type of slavery making up 42% of referrals. Numbers of victims of sexual exploitation and domestic slavery remained steady at 33% and 10% respectively.

During the past seven years the largest number of people supported by The Salvation Army have come from Albania. Other nationalities experiencing sharp rises were India, Pakistan and Iran.
