Y7 Settle In Evening



Step 1: Login
Fill out the details on the page then click the Log In button.
A confirmation of your appointments will be sent to the email address you provide.



Step 2: Select Parents' Evening
Click on the date you wish to book.
Unable to make all of the dates listed? Click *i'm unable to attend*.



Step 3: Select Booking Mode
Choose *Automatic* if you'd like the system to suggest the shortest possible appointment schedule based on the times you're available to attend. To pick the times to book with each teacher, choose *Manual*. Then press *Next*.
We recommend choosing the automatic booking mode when browsing on a mobile device.



Step 4: Select Availability
Drag the sliders at the top of the screen to indicate the earliest and latest you can attend.



Step 5: Choose Teachers
Select the teachers you'd like to book appointments with. A green tick indicates they're selected. To de-select, click on their name.



Step 6: Book Appointments (Automatic)
If you choose the automatic booking mode, you'll see provisional appointments which are held for 2 minutes. To keep them, choose *Accept* at the bottom left.
If it wasn't possible to book every selected teacher during the times you are able to attend, you can either adjust the teachers you wish to meet with and try again, or switch to manual booking mode.

Step 7: Book Appointments
Click any of the green cells to make an appointment. Blue cells signify where you already have an appointment. Grey cells are unavailable.
To change an appointment, delete the original by hovering over the blue box and clicking *Delete*. Then choose an alternate time.
You can optionally leave a message for the teacher to say what you'd like to discuss, or raise anything beforehand.
Once you're finished booking all appointments, at the top of the page in the alert box, press *click here* to finish the booking process.



Step 8: Finished
All your bookings now appear on the My Bookings page. An email confirmation has been sent and you can also print appointments by pressing *Print*. Click *Subscribe to Calendar* to add these and any future bookings to your calendar.
To change your appointments, click on *Amend Bookings*.

ADHD

AWARENESS MONTH



Week 1. What is ADHD?

ADHD is not a new phenomenon. Back in 1899, the philosopher William James, in his book "Talk to Teachers," observed that "some of us are scatter-brained," whilst others "follow easily a train of connected thoughts without temptation to swerve aside to other subjects." He attributed these different types of thinking to differences in our fields of consciousness."

Currently, symptoms of ADHD tend to be noticed at an early age and can be diagnosed when children are 6 to 12 years old but this is not always the case and there are undoubtedly people that have not been recognised in their youth due to lack of awareness and the potential to be diagnosed at the time.

The symptoms of ADHD can improve with age, especially if childhood symptoms are treated so that the developing mind is able to establish habits and routines that mitigate the effects later on. People with ADHD may also have additional mental health issues such as depression, difficulty falling asleep and social or general anxiety disorders. These, "comorbidities" (two medical conditions present at the same time) may need to be treated alongside ADHD symptoms.

While the precise causes of ADHD are not fully understood ADHD is known to be neurodevelopmental, meaning it is due to how the brain and nervous system develop during someone's upbringing. ADHD also often runs in families and is highly genetic.

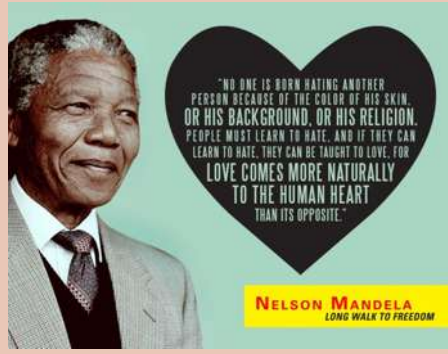
