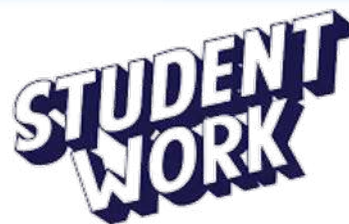

The AI that can draw anything in any style



Will images replace words? Until now, pictures of all kinds have been slow and expensive to make. Now, artificial intelligence can make amazing visuals in the flash of an eye.

An astronaut rides a horse through space. A panda on a motorcycle pumps the gas. A koala slam dunks a basketball. You're not dreaming. This is reality. Or is it? Welcome to the future of photography.

DALL-E 2 is an impressive new AI, grabbing attention with its eye-catching creations. Users give it a word prompt like: "a sea otter in the style of *Girl with a Pearl Earring*". It then generates a remarkably accurate and high-quality image.

Its designers at OpenAI say this is a milestone in technology. "Vision and language are both key parts of human intelligence," says researcher Prafulla Dhariwal. DALL-E 2 connects them, seeing "the world the way humans do". This is a "very important step" toward human-like Artificial General Intelligence.

We are a visual species. Half of the human brain is involved in image-processing, taking a few milliseconds to identify what we see. And we now make more pictures than ever before. The world has around 45 billion cameras – at least five for each of us – and more than 3 billion photos are shared online every day.

But we need words to clarify, inform and understand.

The expression "the camera never lies" has been around since 1859, shortly after the invention of photography. But it's never been true. People have always tampered with pictures, from the *Cottingley Fairies* to AI-generated deepfakes.

DALL-E 2's developers are aware of these downsides. Users will not be able to use it to create violent images or photos of real people. And researcher Mark Chen says it's "exceedingly unlikely" to produce offensive pictures accidentally.

For now, only a few "trusted" users can use DALL-E 2. But the company plans to make it public by the summer. Like the 15th-Century printing press, a powerful technology is about to be unleashed.

Illustrator Christoph Niemann says we are all "fluent in the language of pictures" without even knowing it. But as technology makes it easier to create and share photos, are images replacing the language of words?

Humans were making pictures long before writing. A cave painting of a wild pig in Indonesia is at least 45,500 years old. Egyptian hieroglyphs appeared around 5,000 years ago. But literacy did not become common until after the invention of the printing press in 1439.

Psychologist Piotr Winkielman says "emotive images" have a greater impact on us than words. In his experiments, an image flashing on a screen for only ten milliseconds can alter mood and behaviour. "But people were not swayed by emotional words," however long they stared at them.

However, some say this is why words are worth more than pictures. They involve intellectual work and are less ambiguous and emotive. The printing revolution led to the Enlightenment and giant leaps in science, education and ideas.

Online, "the bulk of information still comes from text and that's unlikely ever to change," says technology expert Paolo Gaudiano. Images catch our attention, inspire or infuriate us.

Art-ificial

Yes: This is happening. We are all fluent in the visual language of symbols, pictures and emojis. The Internet is making this language universal, bringing humanity together in a way that words cannot.

No: A picture is not worth a thousand words. Images cannot express the complex ideas in a novel or a news article. And a picture almost always needs a caption to explain what we are seeing.

Or... Written words are images. They are graphical symbols that represent sounds and concepts. Our minds convert these back into images and this is what artificial intelligence is learning to do.

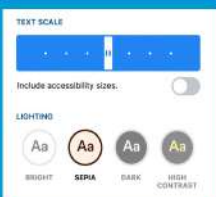

To Boldly Go

(World Space Week 4/10/24-10/10/24)

Depending on your age nearly everyone knows that phrase from the opening titles of the TV programme Star Trek. First shown in 1966 the show was set far in the future (2266-2269) and followed the voyages of a space exploration vessel (USS Enterprise) around the Milky Way Galaxy. In the programmes it's five-year mission was to "explore strange new worlds, to seek out new life and new civilisations, **to boldly go where no man had gone before**". A premise only made scientifically possible because the spaceship could travel at many times the speed of light to cover the vast distances involved.

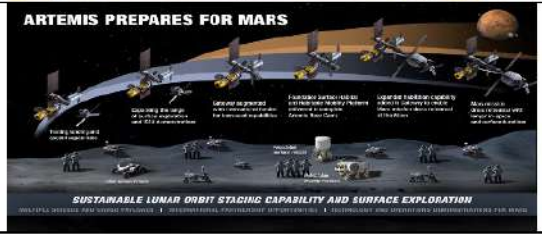

In reality only the unmanned probes Voyager 1 and Voyager 2, both launched in 1977, have so far left the solar system. As of 21 August 2024, Voyager 1 was 14.5 billion miles/ 23.3 billion kilometres (km) from Earth and moving at a velocity of over 38,000 mph/17 km per second- the furthest object created by humans. While the record for the farthest humans have travelled from Earth goes to the crew of the Apollo 13 shuttle who were 400,171km /248,655 miles away from Earth on 14 April 1970.

NASA continue to actively prepare for a mission to Mars and on 6 July 2024 a crew of four emerged from confinement after spending a year living and working in a simulated Mars environment. To survive the crew had to grow their own food to supplement their rations, deal with half-hour communication delays with Earth and learn to live and work together in cramped conditions.



The Artemis programme is a planned crewed spaceflight programme carried out predominately by NASA, US commercial companies and other international partners with the goal of repeating a manned moon landing, first achieved in July 1969 and with the last manned moon landing in December 1972.



NASA sees the Artemis Programme as the next step to establishing a sustainable presence on the moon, laying the foundation for private companies to build a lunar economy and eventually sending humans to Mars.
