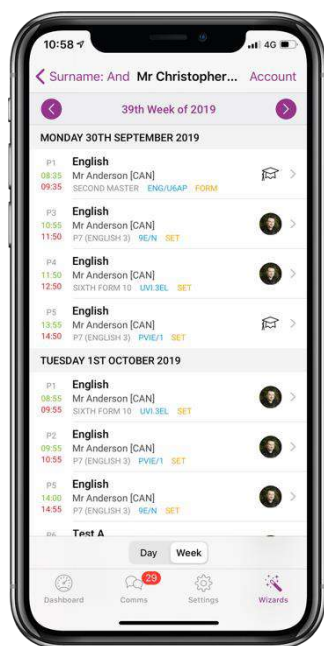

Many of the jobs available today are different to those of our parents. As technology becomes more advanced and society changes, the jobs that young people dream of doing often change too. Safe to say, this can lead to family fights!

Computer programming? Influencing? Well, whatever you want to do, it might just be very different from what your parents have in mind!

Digital generation

New research shows that many young people are inspired by tech-driven and creative roles. Top choices among young people include video game design and **content creation**.

According to the study, three quarters of people aged 11 to 17 say that being online has made them aware of new career opportunities.

Parent pressure

But parents do not always agree about the value of these roles. The study shows that over two-thirds of parents see creative roles as "unstable career choices". This suggests that parents

would prefer their children to enter well-known **professions** such as teaching and law.

Coming together

Despite this disagreement, there are many areas in which parents and their kids feel the same way. Eighty percent of parents believe that social media and technology have helped their children develop **soft skills** like creativity, and **hard skills** like coding.

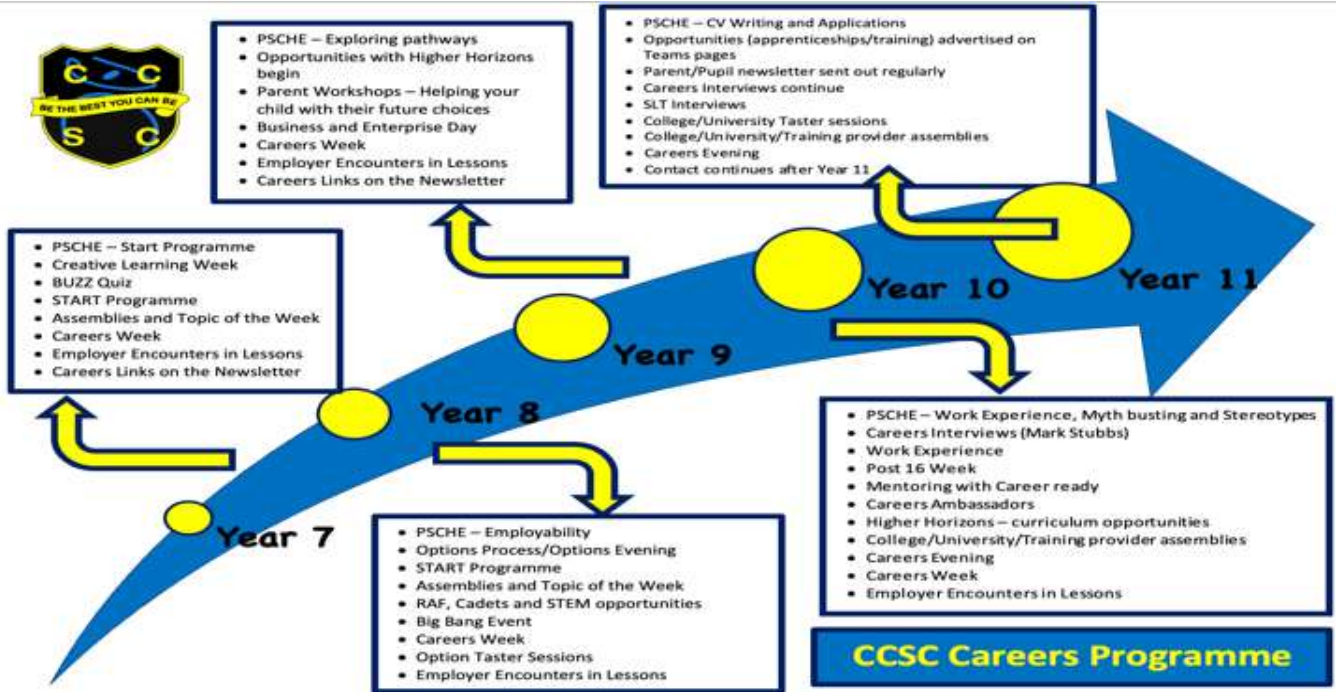

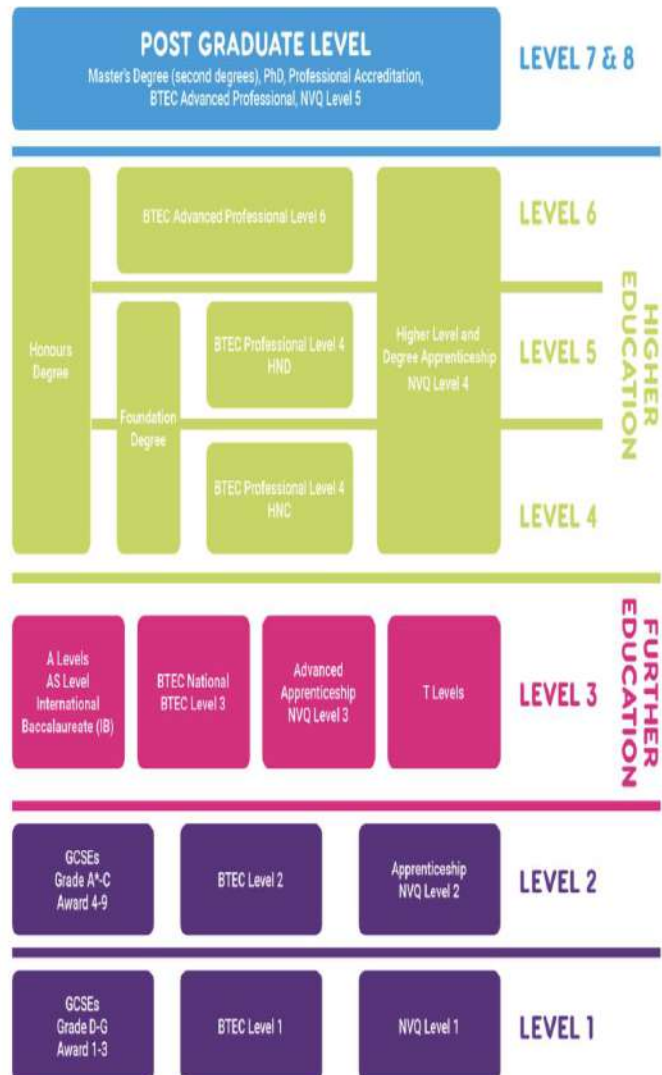

Respect

Respect can be defined as 'a positive feeling or deferential action towards someone or something considered important or held in high esteem or regard.' Put more simply, respect is a way of valuing someone that can be both internalized through thoughts and expressed through words or actions. It is the mindset of 'you matter' towards other people and the behaviour of treating them as such. Ultimately, to respect someone is to recognise their value and treating them in a way that reflects this.

Internally, respect means that you recognise someone's worth. It can be based simply on their humanity; the idea that being human means they have inherent value. This basic respect should ensure we treat each other with decency and dignity. You may also recognise someone's worth due to their actions, abilities, behaviour, experience or their role in society. Externally, respect can be shown by a variety of behaviours. These include listening without interruption, speaking in a polite manner, honouring boundaries, acknowledging feelings or perspectives, treating people fairly, giving credit where appropriate and not acting in an exploitative or manipulating manner.

What does respect look like around the world?

Individualist Cultures (UK, US, Australia, Western Europe)

Respect is often shown by direct communication based on honesty and openness. It is respectful behaviour to treat everyone equally regardless of age or status. Addressing people by their first name is commonplace unless in formal settings. A key concept is independence by respecting personal choices and privacy. Conversely, it is considered disrespectful to talk down to others, violate their personal space or to over-emphasize their hierarchy or titles.

Collectivist Cultures (East Asia, South Asia, Middle East, Latin America)

Emphasis on formality and hierarchy. It is commonplace to address people by their title and surname. General everyday language is generally more formal than the West, while politeness is very important. Respect is gained and maintained by fulfilling social obligations such as familial or social duties. Direct confrontation and public criticism is frowned upon, as is calling elders or superiors by their first names. Traditional roles and customs are expected to be upheld.



A respectful greeting looks very different depending on where you are in the World

High vs Low Context Cultures- In Asia respect is shown through silence or quiet, subtle gestures. Group harmony is important. In the West, we are more direct with an emphasis on clarity, valuing truth over comfort. Indirectness may be seen as confusing or dishonest.

Humility vs Assertiveness- modesty and self-deprecation are valued in Japan, Korea & Thailand. Confident self-promotion can be viewed as disrespectful. The opposite is true in the US, Germany and Israel where too much softness can be seen as weakness rather than respectful.

Is Being Late Disrespectful? - it depends where you are! Very much so in Germany or the USA, not so much in Latin American or the Middle East.
