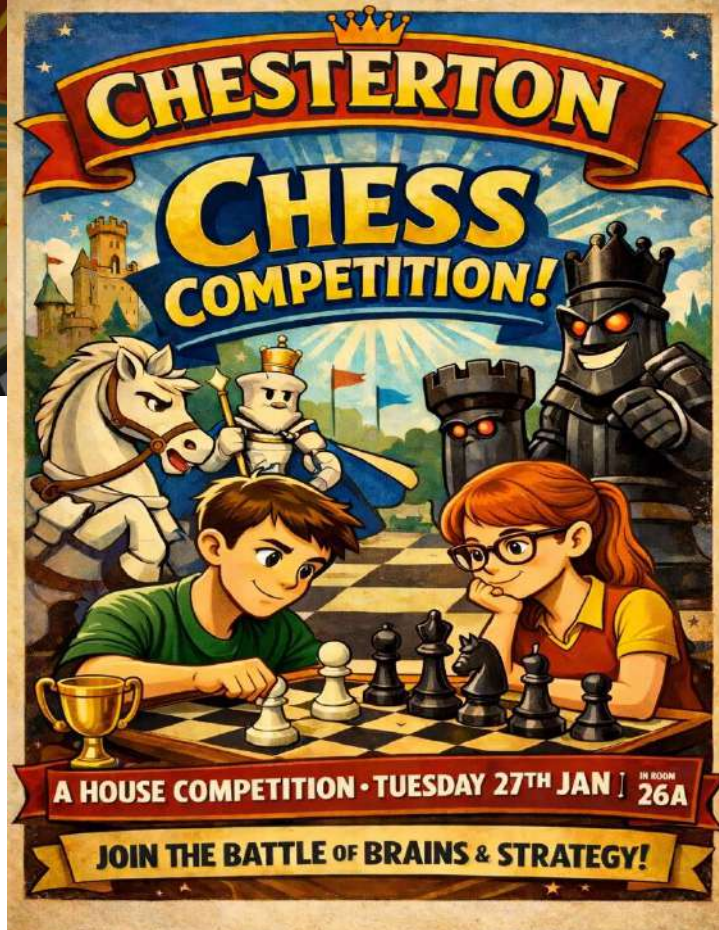

## REVISE How To Revise/Recap



- Summarise**
  - Read a topic/chapter/page and summarise into 5 bullet points.
- 5 Questions**
  - Read the topic/chapter/page and write your own 5 questions with answers.
- Definitions**
  - Pick 5 keywords and write the meaning.
- Picture**
  - Draw a diagram/picture and label it to explain what it shows.
- Video**
  - Watch a SHORT video on YouTube on a topic/keyword/concept and pause it at appropriate times to make 5 bullet points.
- Quiz**
  - Find 10 questions on kahoot, booklet or educake, answer them and make notes on anything you learn or need to remember.
- Mind Map**
  - Pick a topic and draw a mind map explaining 10 key points.
- Copy**
  - Pick a topic and read the crucial knowledge. Copy 5 sentences that you don't remember or understand.
- Memory**
  - Look at the crucial knowledge for 30 seconds. Cover it up and write down everything you can remember in 30 seconds. Repeat 3 times.
- Flash Card**
  - Pick a topic/chapter/page and on the front of the flash card write 5 keywords/phrases or pictures and on the back write what they mean.
- Exam Questions/Past Papers**
  - Pick a topic and answer exam questions. Ensure you use a mark scheme to check your answers. Past Papers can be found online and downloaded.
- Worksheets/Workbooks**
  - Pick a topic and complete a placemat or worksheet on that topic. Ask your teacher and they will print/send you lots. Use your memory first and then use other resources such as the crucial knowledge to help you.

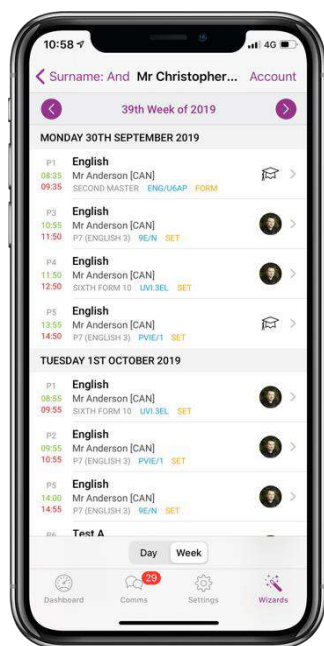

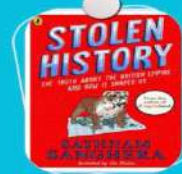

## 3 Spanish Christmas traditions you probably never knew about

### 1. El Gordo – The Fat Lottery

One of the most exciting Spanish Christmas traditions is playing the lottery. Almost everyone takes part in the Spanish National Lottery at Christmas time, making it the biggest lottery in the world. It's so big, it's called 'El Gordo' or 'the Fat One', because of the huge cash prizes of more than 2 billion euros.

It's been held every year since 1812 and it's a tradition for the winning numbers to be announced live on TV on the morning of December 22nd. As the winning numbers are called, they're sung out by a choir of school children.



### 2. The Three Kings

In Spain, it's the Three Kings or the Three Wise Men (known as Reyes Magos – Melchior, Gaspar and Baltazar) who bring the gifts to good children at Christmas time. They also don't come on Christmas Eve.

Instead, towns and cities hold huge Three Kings parades ('cabalgatas') on the night of January 5th, where the Kings parade through the towns on floats and throw out sweets for the kids. It's one of the most wonderful Spanish Christmas traditions you can't miss!



### 3. Dia de los Santos Inocentes

While you might think it's time to relax after Christmas, in Spain, it's time to watch your back! Dia de los Santos Inocentes is the Spanish version of April Fool's Day, but it's held on December 28. It's the day for playing harmless pranks or dressing up in funny wigs, glasses and hats, and once you prank someone, you shout "Inocente, inocente!"

And when we say watch your back, we mean it... One of the most popular pranks is to tape a drawing of a stick figure on someone's back!

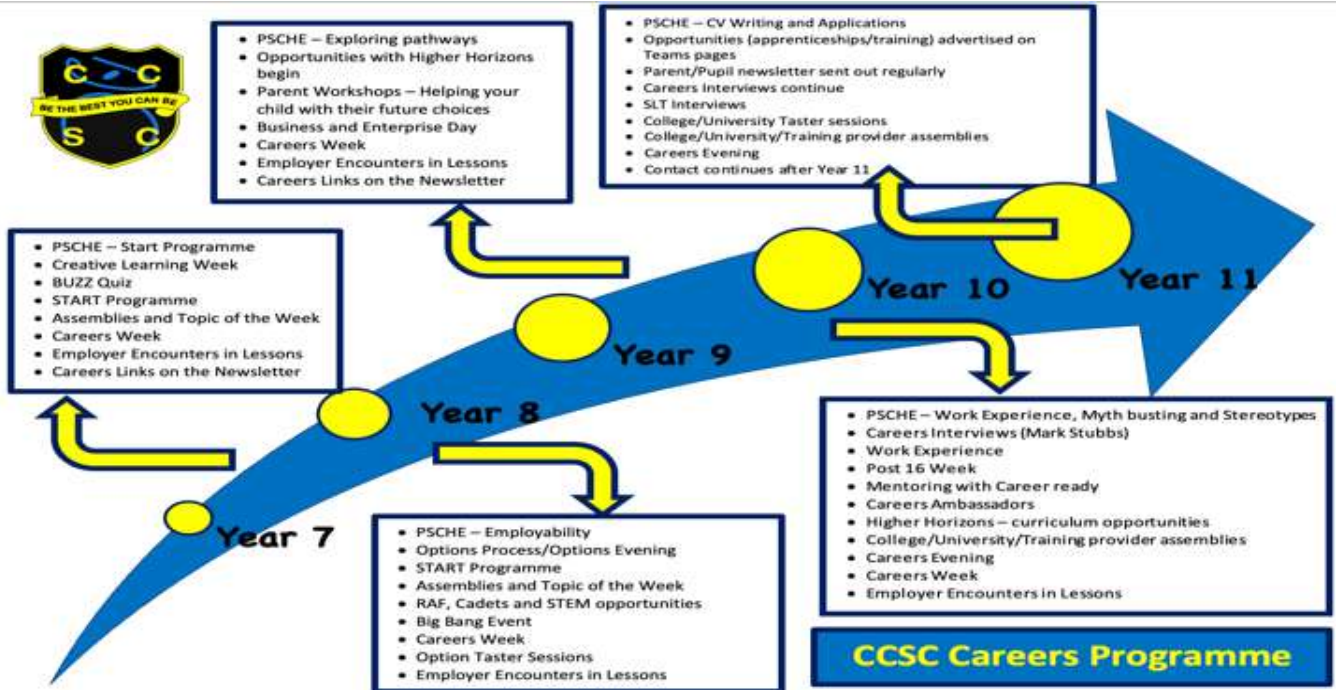

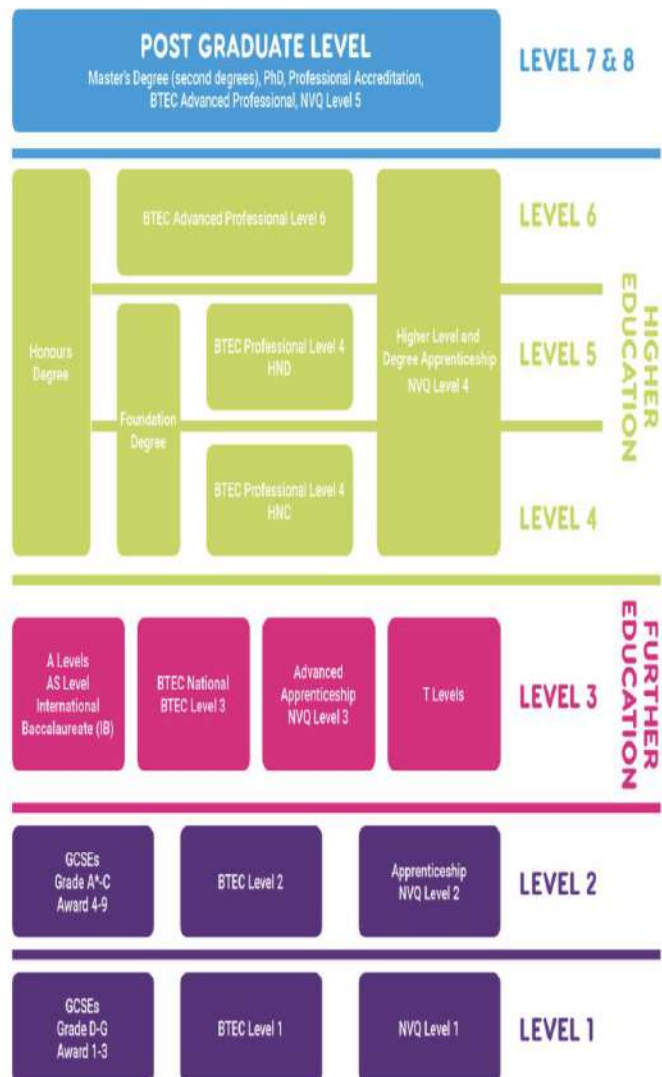

## Medicine

Medicine is the science and practice of caring for patients. This includes prevention, diagnosis, prognosis and treatment of illness and disease, along with palliative care and health promotion. Modern medicine applies numerous branches of science including biomedical science, anatomy & physiology, genetics, biochemistry and psychology. Contemporary medicine is generally conducted by health care systems within the public or private sector. A healthcare system will include GP surgeries, hospitals and supporting services.

While medicine is the science and practice of caring for patients, it has been practiced since prehistoric times, and for much of that time was considered as an artform. Early tribes will have used certain plants and animal extracts to treat illness along with rituals often performed by holy men or elders. In Ancient Greece, Hippocrates developed the concept of the four body humors, whereby good health could be achieved by keeping blood, phlegm, yellow bile and black bile in balance. Links were also made between health and temperature. The Middle Ages saw the development of hospitals as places of treatment, while the Church was actively involved with healthcare. The Black Death of the 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> centuries led to radical new medical thinking and the earliest signs of medicine as science soon arose.

### Significant Figures in The History of Modern Medicine

- **William Harvey (1578-1657)**- first discovered the circulation of blood and the heart's blood-pumping role.
- **Louis Pasteur (1822-1895)**- developed the germ theory of disease, the idea that infectious disease is caused by microorganisms. He also discovered the principles of vaccination and pasteurisation.
- **Joseph Lister (1827-1912)**- pioneered the practice of antiseptic surgery using carbolic acid, making surgery safer for patients
- **Florence Nightingale (1820-1910)**- championed sanitation and founded the principles of modern nursing
- **Alexander Fleming (1881-1955)**- discovered penicillin and the principles of antibiotics



Medical Marvels: Pasteur, Lister, Fleming, Curie, Freud

- **Marie Curie (1867-1934)**- pioneer of radiation research, laid the foundations for medical imaging and modern cancer therapy
- **Sigmund Freud (1856-1939)**- developed psychoanalysis, a major influence of modern psychiatry
- **James Watson/Francis Crick/Rosalind Franklin (1950s)**- discovered the structure of DNA, laying the foundation for modern genetics
