Science Y10 - Hayley Butler

Fractional distillation

→ as the vapours rise through the column, they cool down

→ the vapours condense and remain at the column below their boiling point

→ the lightest vapours rise highest

→ the heaviest vapours remain lowest

→ crude oil is heated to evaporate it

→ crude oil is heated and evaporates

→ gases rise up a fractionating column, cool down and condense

→ they condense at different points depending on the boiling point

→ most viscous (thick, sticky) at the bottom of the column

→ highest boiling point at the bottom of the column

Fraction	uses
gases	domestic heating & cooking
pentane	flats for cars
naphthalene	dyes and resins
kerosene	Fuel for aircraft
Diesel	fuel for some cars, and trains
fuel oil	fuel for large ships and power stations
bitumen	surfacing roads and roads

Crude oil is formed underwater. It can be refined at a refinery. Crude oil is a mixture of substances called hydrocarbons. Fractionation - this separates the different fractions.

Hydrocarbons: oil, petrol

CCSC UNIFORM POLICY



Blazers

- Black blazer with school badge must be worn.
- All other items - coats, jackets, hoodies must be worn over your school blazer.
- Blazer can be removed in lessons - with teacher permission.

Jumpers

- Plain black jumper (no logos) may be worn under your school blazer.

Trousers

- Black, formal tailored trousers to be worn.
- The following are not allowed: Leggings, fitted trousers, Lycra style or any trousers that do not cover the ankle.
- Black socks preferred to be worn.

Skirts

- School skirt with logo (from school shop).
- Appropriate length and not rolled up at the waist.
- Worn with black tights or black socks. No other coloured socks allowed

Hair, Nails, Make up and Jewellery:

- Hair must be of a natural colour
- Pupils with dyed hair must have it tied up and it will be monitored until it grows out.
- No false nails or nail varnish.
- No false eyelashes or lash extensions.
- Watches allowed - no rings or bracelets
 - One set of studs or small hoops permitted.
 - Nose studs not allowed.

Devices and Equipment:

- Apron required for Technology.
- AirPods / earphones are not allowed in lessons (may be confiscated).

- School tie worn properly and visible.

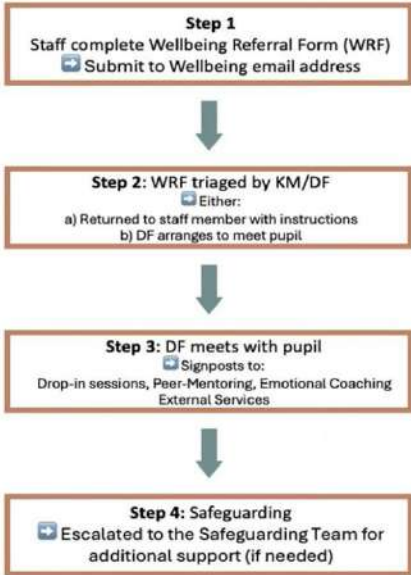

Fair Play

The concept of 'fair play' can be interpreted in several different ways. The most obvious interpretation is in a sporting context. The idea of fair play in sport emphasises the idea that winning is not everything. Sometimes it is the manner of conduct and the spirit in which competition is entered that is more important. Winning without respecting the rules, your opponents and the integrity of the sport is a hollow victory. The principles of fair play can be translated to other areas of life. Conducting yourself with honesty, integrity and accountability brings the principles of fair play to everyday life, as does sharing responsibilities in the home and standing up for and being considerate of others.

Fair play is something we practice every day, even if we don't always realise it. Little acts of fairness such as taking turns, sharing credit or admitting when we are in the wrong can make a big difference to those around us. In school, a fair environment promotes inclusion, avoids favouritism and respects different opinions, giving everyone an equal opportunity to succeed. In a social context, fair play may involve giving fair access to education and justice, along with equality regardless of background. A society thrives when everyone has an equal chance to succeed and when people work together. It allows us to think beyond simply looking after ourselves, instead putting efforts into systems that can benefit us all.

World Cup Special: Fair Play in Football

To mark the beginning of the World Cup this week, the time seemed appropriate to compile some notable 'fair play' moments from football's recent history:

- **Di Canio's Catch (2000)**- with the scores level at 1-1, West Ham drove into Everton's box but keeper Paul Gerrard managed to push the ball away from the striker's toe and out towards the wing, injuring himself in the process. With Gerrard lying prone on the floor, a West Ham winger crossed the ball to maverick Italian striker Paolo Di Canio to nod into an unguarded net. Instead, Di Canio caught the ball in his hands and gestured towards injured Gerrard, passing up the chance of a winning goal but winning the hearts of football fans everywhere for his sporting gesture of fair play.
- **No foul on Fowler (1997)**- while playing for Liverpool at Arsenal, Robbie Fowler was awarded a penalty when the referee thought he'd been fouled by Arsenal goalkeeper David Seaman. Fowler protested that there had been no foul and that the spot-kick should be rescinded but the referee ignored his pleas. Not wanting to profit from a mistake, Fowler stepped up himself and deliberately took a half-hearted penalty which Seaman was able to save with ease. His honesty and integrity was widely praised.



Fair Play Moments: Klose owns up and Di Canio catches the ball

- **On Klose Inspection (2012)**- playing for Lazio, German striker Miroslav Klose accidentally scored with his hand. Feeling it was unfair, Klose told the referee and asked for the goal to be rescinded. The goal was chalked off and Klose won praise for his honesty.
- **Settling the score (1999)**- In a Premier League match against Aston Villa, Leeds scored a goal but the Villa players appeared to have stopped because they believed a team-mate was injured. Leeds manager David O'Leary felt his side had gained an unfair advantage and instructed his players to let Villa walk the ball into the net on the restart, thus re-leveling the score.
