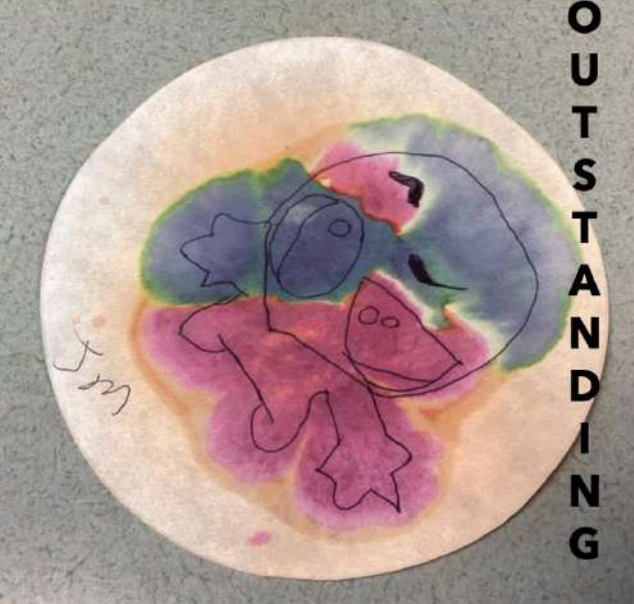
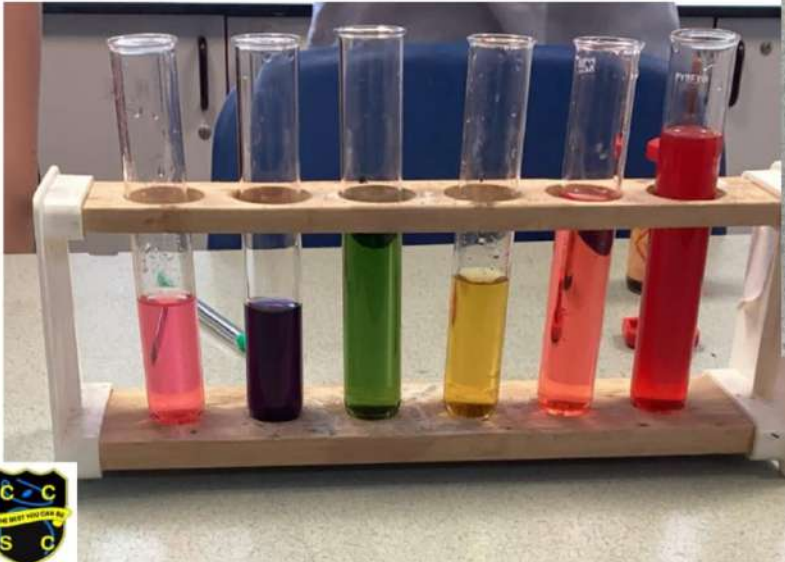

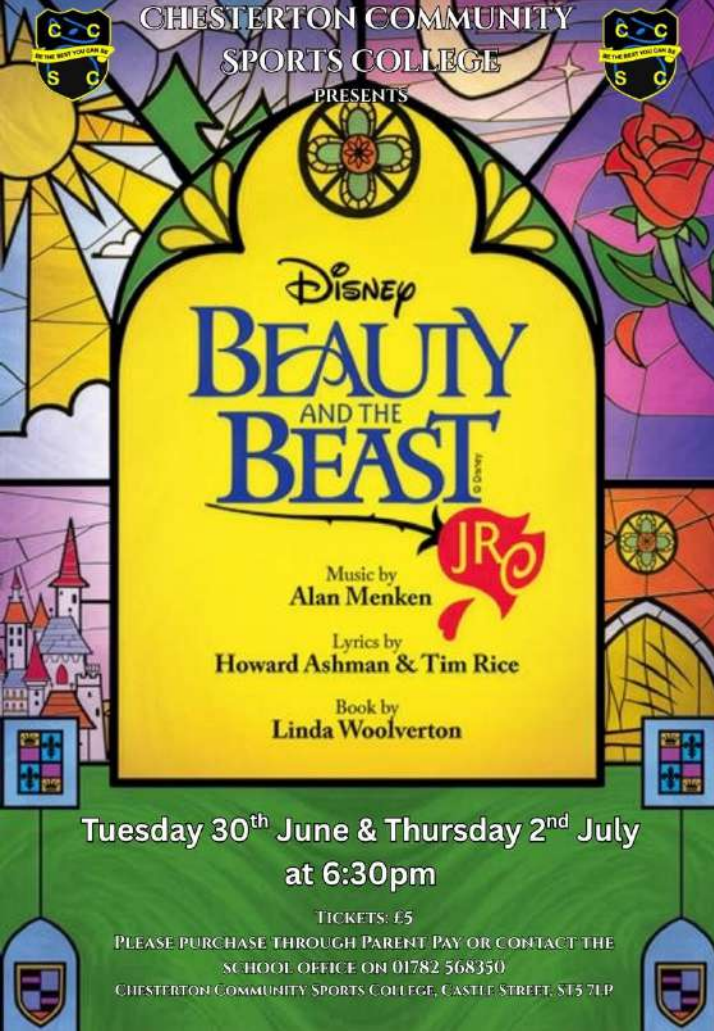

CCSC UNIFORM POLICY

Blazers

- Black blazer with school badge must be worn.
- All other items - coats, jackets, hoodies must be worn over your school blazer.
- Blazer can be removed in lessons - with teacher permission.

Jumpers

- Plain black jumper (no logos) may be worn under your school blazer.

Trousers

- Black, formal tailored trousers to be worn.
- The following are not allowed: Leggings, fitted trousers, Lycra style or any trousers that do not cover the ankle.
- Black socks preferred to be worn.

Skirts

- School skirt with logo (from school shop).
- Appropriate length and not rolled up at the waist.
- Worn with black tights or black socks. No other coloured socks allowed

Hair, Nails, Make up and Jewellery:

- Hair must be of a natural colour
- Pupils with dyed hair must have it tied up and it will be monitored until it grows out.
- No false nails or nail varnish.
- No false eyelashes or lash extensions.
- Watches allowed - no rings or bracelets
 - One set of studs or small hoops permitted.
 - Nose studs not allowed.

Devices and Equipment:

- Apron required for Technology.
- AirPods / earphones are not allowed in lessons (may be confiscated).
- Mobile phones must not be used in school.

Shirt and Tie

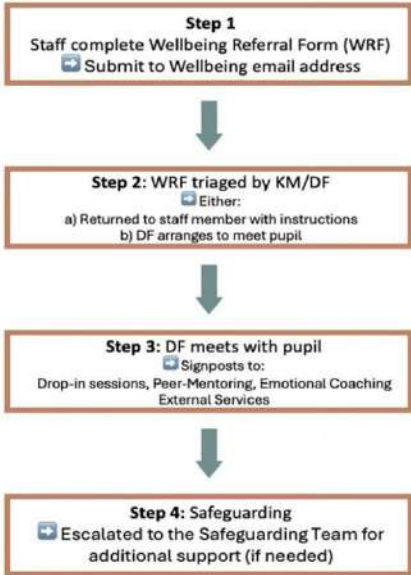
- White traditional shirt with buttons done to the collar.

Parents

In purely biological terms, a parent is defined as the progenitor of an offspring. In other words, a parent is a person from whom an individual has inherited their genes. In species that reproduce sexually, an individual will have two parents, from both of which they inherit 50% of their genes. In species that breed asexually, there is only one parent and the offspring will be a genetic clone of the parent. The term 'parent' is also more widely used in Biology. A parent cell produces daughter cells in cell division. A parent strand of DNA acts as a template for a newly synthesized strand in DNA replication. The term 'parent generation' features in Mendelian genetics.

In human terms, we extend the definition of what we mean by a parent. While the biological meaning of parents is still true, it does not necessarily encompass the full range of people we would consider to be parents. Anyone who is a primary caregiver to a person may be considered and referred to as a parent. In some cases, people may have adoptive parents who have legally volunteered to take on a parenting role when the biological parents are not able to fulfil this duty for one reason or another. In other such cases, a grandparent or other relative may adopt the parenting role in practice. Foster parents also perform this role on a more temporary basis. Step-parents are also common, when one half of a couple may have children from a previous relationship. A woman can also become a parent through surrogacy. Who we consider our parents is often more about our emotions than our genetics.

Memorable Parents in Fiction

The parent-child dynamic is often a key theme in fiction, so it's no surprise that fictional works have produced some memorable parents:

- **Homer Simpson (The Simpsons)**- the patriarch of the Simpson family may have his faults, but one aspect of his character that can't be questioned is his love for his children, as he has proven time and time again.
- **Mufasa (The Lion King)**- the wise father of Simba was not just a caring father, but his lessons continued to guide his son long after his tragic death.
- **Marlin (Finding Nemo)**- a single father, he begins the movie somewhat overprotective of his only remaining son Nemo, but when Nemo is captured by scuba divers, his devotion sees him traverse a whole ocean to bring his son home.



Famous in fiction: Homer Simpson, Mufasa, a redeemed Darth Vader and Molly Weasley

- **Molly Weasley (Harry Potter)**- caring matriarch of the Weasley clan who also develops into an important mother-figure to orphaned Harry as the series progresses, considering him as one of her own.
- **Darth Vader (Star Wars)**- Luke Skywalker discovers that Vader is his father in a classic cinema moment. On opposing sides, their relationship is complex but seeing Luke near death at the Emperor's hand, Vader sacrifices his own life to save his son's, completing his redemption.
