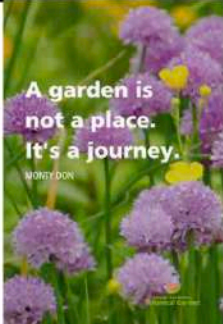
GARDEN CLUB

Victorian Newcastle-under-Lyme (1837-1901)



Queens Gardens, Newcastle Town Centre.

As it's name suggests the park was a "Jubilee Park." The land was bought in 1887 which was the year of Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee (60 years on the throne). The gardens were laid out in 1889 and they stood in front of the, then, Municipal Hall. The original railings around the outside of the park along with a low brick wall were removed in 1935 to make the area more open.



Crimean War Canon- Brampton Museum

The canon is one of thousands of similar pieces of war booty brought back from the Crimea following the fall of the Russian citadel of Sevastopol in 1855. In that city the Allied armies had discovered a large ordnance depot filled with 4,000 damaged or obsolete guns. These along with many of the guns captured during the fighting were later used as ballast on the merchantmen and troopships when they were bringing the army home. The Crimean War (1854- 1856), had been an horrendous and pointless conflict and perhaps as part of a wider public relations exercise to calm the national anger at the lives lost and at how badly the war had been run, these cannons were freely distributed to towns and cities around the country.

Industry

Nationally, the town first ranked with Chester, York and Hull as the four major tobacco-pipe producers. The industry continued until the mid-19th century, when decline set in rapidly, so that by 1881 it had only one tobacco-pipe maker left. The town also had a flourishing top hat/felt hat manufacturing industry, probably at its peak locally in the 1820s, when a third of the town's population were involved in over 20 factories, but by 1892 there was only one still in production.

During the 19th century the population steadily increased. In 1801 it was 4,604 and this figure had been doubled by 1841. In 1891 the number of inhabitants was 17,805, nearly four times the 1801 figure.



Wesak, known as Buddha Jayanti, Buddha Purnima, Vesak, or Buddha Day, is a holiday observed by Buddhists in South Asia and Southeast Asia, as well as Tibet and Mongolia. This festival celebrates the birth, enlightenment (Nirvana) and death of Gautama Buddha, the founder of Buddhism.
