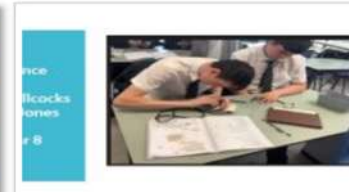



## 24. Balance a Card on a Cup

## We have been studying 'The instruments of the Orchestra' this half term.

Have you liked what you have heard?



There are spaces available to learn a variety of instruments with us at CCSC, starting as soon as after the Easter holiday.

**The Woodwind Family:** you can learn recorder - flute - oboe - clarinet - saxophone - bassoon (Maybe look them up and listen to their sounds if you don't know what some of them are!)



**The brass Family:** trumpet, trombone, French horn and tuba.



**The string family:** Violin, viola, cello Double bass.

**Percussion family:** anything you hit – from djembes to the drum kit.



Don't forget the **piano and the voice.**

Children would be expected to sign up for at least the remainder of the year and can continue lessons while at CCSC. The cost is heavily subsidised by school and as a general rule much cheaper than private lessons. Lessons are weekly in term time with practice required between lessons.

Instruments are available to hire for free, there may be some cost for reeds and tutor books.

Anybody can learn and playing a musical instrument is proven to help all learning. As a colleague once said - you never find a stupid musician!

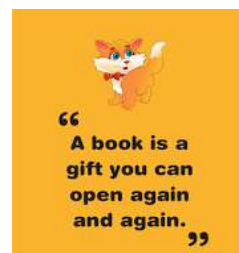
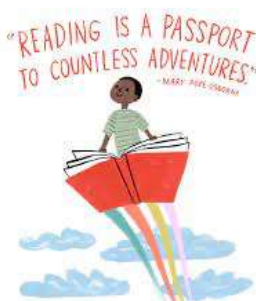

# Know More, Remember More Understand It, Apply It

### How to Be Forgiven: 7 Actions We Can Take

We all make mistakes, and we inevitably find ourselves in situations where we need to be forgiven. There are however effective ways for how to ask for forgiveness. **Most importantly we must be truly sorry and understand and admit we were wrong.** One model for seeking forgiveness called **CONFESS** was proposed by a Dr Everett Worthington (Clinical Psychologist) in 2003 and has 7 elements for how to communicate when one is wrong.

- **C:** Confession without an excuse: we must say that we did wrong and name the wrongdoing specifically.
- **O:** Offer of a genuine apology. An apology involves taking responsibility and expressing remorse and contrition. Most importantly, we must get across the idea that we are truly remorseful and contrite, ashamed, guilty and disappointed, even if we do not say explicitly the words "I'm sorry." The key is to communicate the sadness and sorrow for having done the hurtful or offensive act.
- **N:** Note the pain of the other person. We need to express empathy for the person we're asking forgiveness from and show that we understand their experience. It also helps to describe what we perceive them experiencing and suffering in a way that suggests that we understand their perspective and emotional experience and can even identify with them had we been in the same situation.
- **F:** Forever value the relationship. It is important to express how resolving the relationship problems is more valuable to us than winning or being right and are willing to offer to sacrifice whatever is necessary to resolve the difficulty.
- **E:** Equalize through restitution. However uncomfortable, we need to ask if there is anything that can be done to make up for the wrongdoing but must resist making suggestions of restitution as people understand love in different ways and value different things as an expression of it. Then be willing to do the restitution or negotiate something comparable.
- **S:** Say we will never do it again. We need to also express how we will never try to hurt him or her in the same way ever again.
- **S:** Seek forgiveness by explicitly asking for it as in: "Can you forgive me for hurting you?"

Clearly it requires the humility (freedom from pride or arrogance) of someone who is truly sorry.
