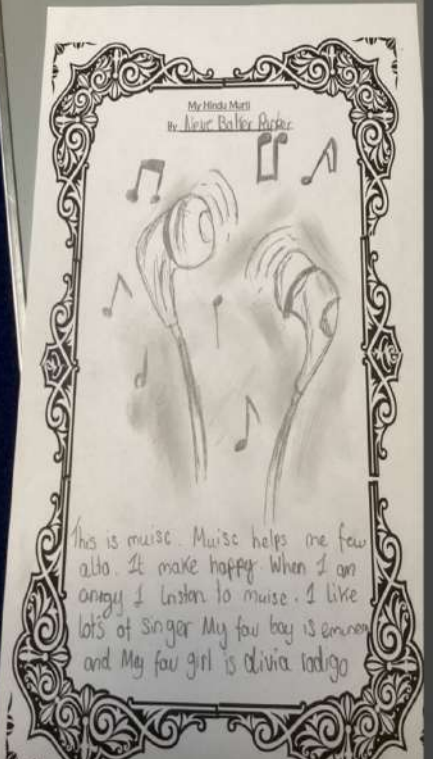

Robots mean 'more jobs for video gamers'

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Gameplan: In the US the gaming industry is more than 1.5 times the size of the film industry.

Should gamers embrace AI? Games keep getting bigger, better, and more expensive to produce. Some companies hope to use AI to fill in the gaps, but workers worry about their future.

Video games have never been famed for the quality of their dialogue. In fact, the **Guinness Book of World Records** even has a record for the worst ever line of dialogue in a video game.

But others are not convinced. They say AI is still not powerful enough to create good games.

Writing a script, they argue, takes originality and imagination. All AI can do is mash together words they find from other sources. It cannot produce anything new.

AI is also generally programmed to avoid anything that will cause conflict or controversy. But any good story needs conflict between characters. Critics think AI-generated video game scripts would risk becoming a bland mush.

Still others think this is not really about making video games better. It is about threatening workers.

Workers in the video game industry often face terrible conditions. Insiders accuse companies of overworking their employees and fostering sexist environments.

Things are at their worst during the final weeks before the game is released — a period known as “crunch time”. Some have reported working as many as 20 hours a day in this period for no extra pay. And after the game is released, many lose their jobs.

Workers have started to push back against this kind of treatment. Last year workers at game company Raven Software went on strike and voted to form a **union**. Surveys show that 78% of game workers would support a union at their company.¹

Some big industry names have recently unveiled AI assistants for creating future games. Ubisoft has “Ghostwriter” to generate dialogue. **Roblox** has developed an AI that can help write code.

Industry leaders insist that bringing in AI is not about laying off workers. Richard Wilson, who runs TIGA, a body representing game developers, claimed AI would mean both more games and more jobs.

But some think it is no coincidence that game companies are starting to talk about AI now their workers are forming unions. They claim the companies want to use the threat of AI to keep their workers in line.

Should we embrace AI?

Gamechanger

Yes: The constant demand for bigger and better games is breaking the industry. AI can take off some of the pressure by helping human writers and coders to produce top-quality games.

No: AI is no substitute for human ingenuity. All the evidence we have suggests that AI is incapable of producing anything new and exciting. All this will do is fuel a race to the bottom.

Or... This is not really about the quality of the games. Companies want to use the threat of automation to stop their workers from unionising, and to ensure that if necessary they can replace their human workforces.

PHARMACIST

WHAT IS A PHARMACIST?

A pharmacist is a healthcare professional that is an expert in medicines and can help people in a range of ways. Pharmacists are trained to carry out medication reviews for patients with health issues and they prepare, handle, store and dispense a variety of medications. They are usually found in a local pharmacy.

WHAT QUALIFICATIONS ARE NEEDED?

There are not any set university entry requirements to become a pharmacist, but generally you need three A-levels in chemistry and a second science or maths. Alongside A-levels, most pharmacy's expect a minimum of five GCSEs including one science, maths and English language. To become a full-time pharmacist you need to complete a five-year programme of academic and practice-based teaching.

- Being able to work as part of a team with other professionals
- Attention to detail
- Ability to multitask

Magic trick of the week – try this!!!



14. The 'Floating' card!

You will need:

An easy card trick, but will need lots of practicing to make it look natural – first you will need a pack or 'deck' of playing cards.

Step 1: You will have to learn how to "find" a "lost card" in a deck of cards. To do so, simply place the card on the top of the deck, and practice the fake shuffle that ends up with the card on top of the deck.

Step 2: Hold the deck in your off hand with the faces pointing forwards, and hold the index finger of your writing hand over the deck.

Step 3: Bring the index finger down to "hit" the deck of cards, extend your pinky/little finger to touch the deck and grip the card (that has been placed on the top of the deck), and pull it up with you as you go.

If you can get this trick right, you can make it look like the card is rising all on its own, but it will be a bit tricky to get it right.



21st World Religion Day
(Week beginning 15th January 2024)

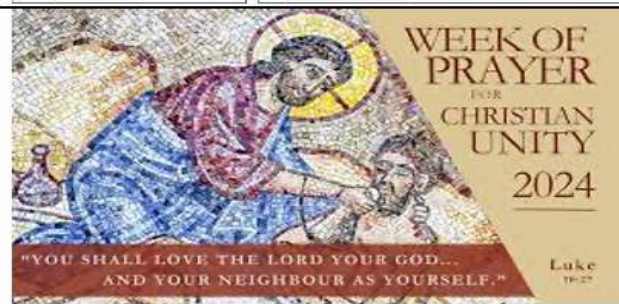
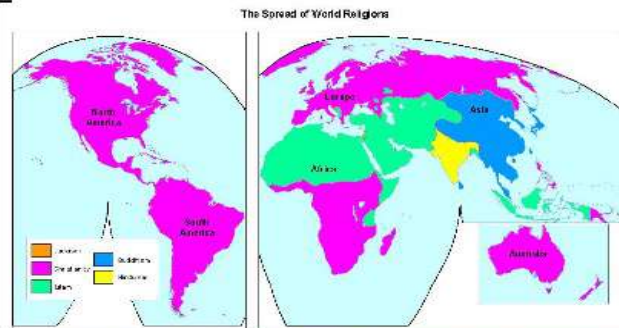
FAITH (as a word, has two different meanings: one secular (non-religious) and one based around religious belief).

1. Complete trust or confidence in someone or something.
2. Strong belief in the doctrines of a religion based on spiritual conviction, rather than proof.

Although it is estimated that there are over 4000 religions, faith groups and denominations worldwide it is generally accepted that there are 5 major world religions. These and their estimated number of followers are Christianity (2.5 billion), Islam (2 billion), Hinduism (1.2 billion), Buddhism (500 million) and Judaism (14.3 million).

Hinduism is believed to be the oldest of the Religions dating back to over 2000 years B.C., Buddhism is of a similar age and in contemporary Hinduism, the Buddha is revered by Hindus. These are followed by Judaism around 1250 B.C., Christianity beginning in 30 A.D., and Islam around 600 AD, Interestingly, Judaism, Islam and Christianity all have their roots in Gods relationship with the prophet Abraham, as recorded in the Bible, in the Book of Genesis.

The 18th January 2024 is the beginning of a week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Christianity is broadly split into three branches: Catholic, Protestant and (Eastern) Orthodox. As elsewhere in Europe Catholicism was the established religion in the UK until the 16th century. In 1534 Henry VIII was made head of the Church of England although the Catholic religion remained intact. Under the following successive monarchs Catholics and then Protestants were persecuted followed by a period of increasing tolerance. In 1689 after much debate Parliament passed the Toleration Act giving freedom of religion to dissenters provided subjects took a simplified oath of allegiance. A principle that continued most recently in the Human Rights Act 1998 which includes the right to freedom of religion and belief.
