# Macbeth - The Day



William Shakespeare's shortest, bloodiest tragedy, *Macbeth*, is a good starting point for those unfamiliar with the Bard's works. It follows the hero of the title, a Scottish general, as he schemes to become king of Scotland — encouraged by his wife, the manipulative Lady Macbeth. The play is not an easy ride: it is relentlessly dark, packing murder, madness and marital breakdown into its compact size. Yet it is one of Shakespeare's most enduringly popular plays — filming began on a new adaptation, starring Denzel Washington, until Covid-19 halted production.

Macbeth tells the classic story of how the greed for power corrupts. Having been told that absolute power is possible, Macbeth's greed begins to consume him and erode his moral compass. Where he begins as a humble soldier, he soon becomes an amoral and bloodthirsty traitor willing to stop at nothing to consolidate his rule. Likewise, Lady Macbeth's musings on ambition lead her to invoke dark spirits which will fill her with the cruelty she needs to assist her husband in his quest for power. Macbeth's greed for the throne also outweighs his practical considerations: each of his actions seems, to him, a means to an end, but once he has acquired power, maintaining his position as King still requires constant violence, oppression and elimination of threat.

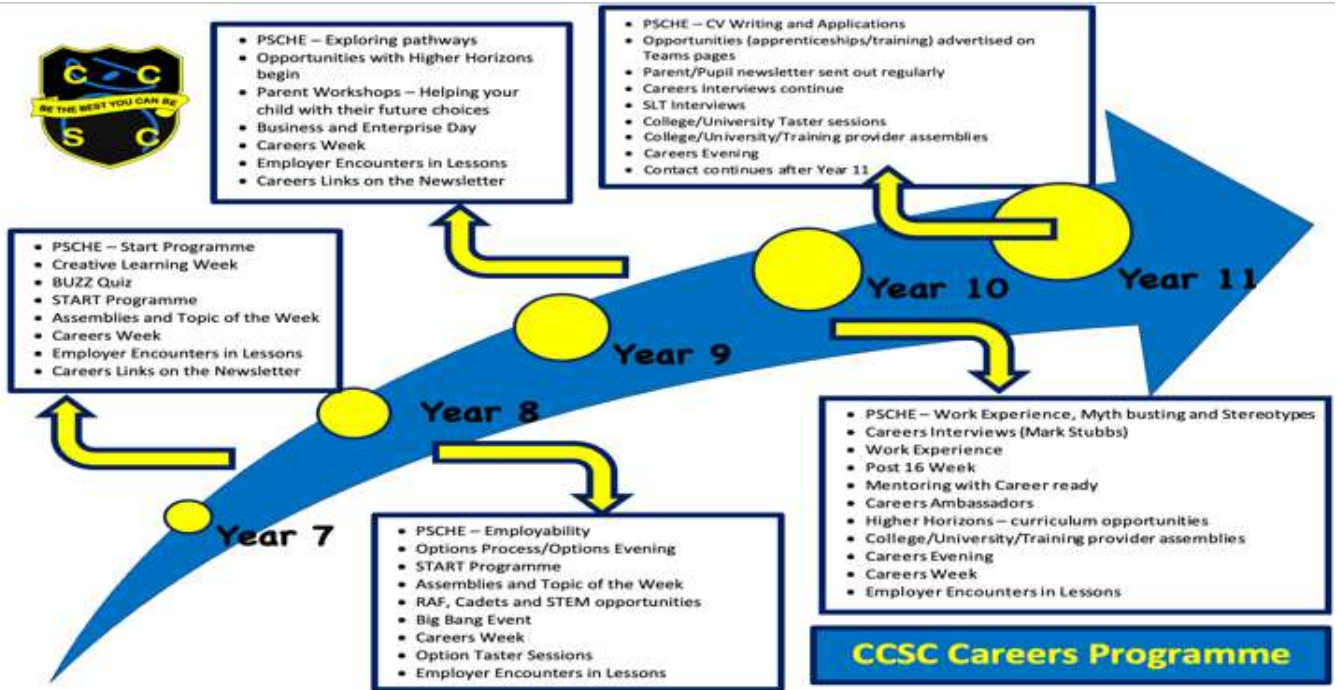

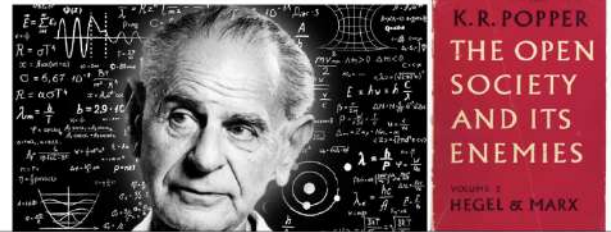
## Tolerance

The word 'tolerance' has many meanings in the English language. In biology, tolerance can mean how effective an organism is to withstand stresses such as disease, pain and lack of water or light. In engineering, the tolerance of an object is the allowable variation in size or weight in a construction. The word 'tolerance' is also commonly used in statistics and mathematics. In pharmacology, humans can develop drug or alcohol tolerance, reducing the effect of the drug on the individual.

In general everyday use, 'tolerance' is defined as 'the ability or willingness to tolerate (allow the existence of, without interference) the existence of opinions or behaviour that one dislikes or disagrees with.' Tolerance is an important cornerstone of a modern liberal society such as the UK. The diversity of the UK makes it inevitable that others may hold opinions, beliefs or viewpoints that are not necessarily shared. Indeed, there are many communities where groups with opposing beliefs live and work in close proximity to each other. To be able to peacefully co-exist despite these differing viewpoints is a key value of Western society.

### The Paradox of Intolerance

The paradox of intolerance is a philosophical concept first proposed by philosopher Karl Popper in his 1945 book 'The Open Society and Its Enemies.' He suggested that if a society is completely tolerant, even of intolerant ideas, then the intolerant view will eventually dominate the tolerant. In practice, if a society tolerates all viewpoints, even those that seek to suppress, harm and eliminate others then that group is provided with a platform to gain power and ultimately dismantle the tolerant society that allowed them to grow in the first place. The 1945 publish date of Popper's work is illuminating as the rise of the Nazis in Germany is a perfect example of the dangers he proposes. The Weimar republic created in Germany after World War I was one of the most open and liberal democracies of the age, a position that the Nazis exploited to rise to power. Once in power, they used their position to strip away freedom, democracy, human rights and civil liberties.

Popper goes on to propose that a tolerant society must be intolerant of intolerance when that intolerance threatens violence, suppression or the very foundations of an open society. We see examples of how this concept is implemented in the UK with hate speech laws and the banning of terrorist organisations.
