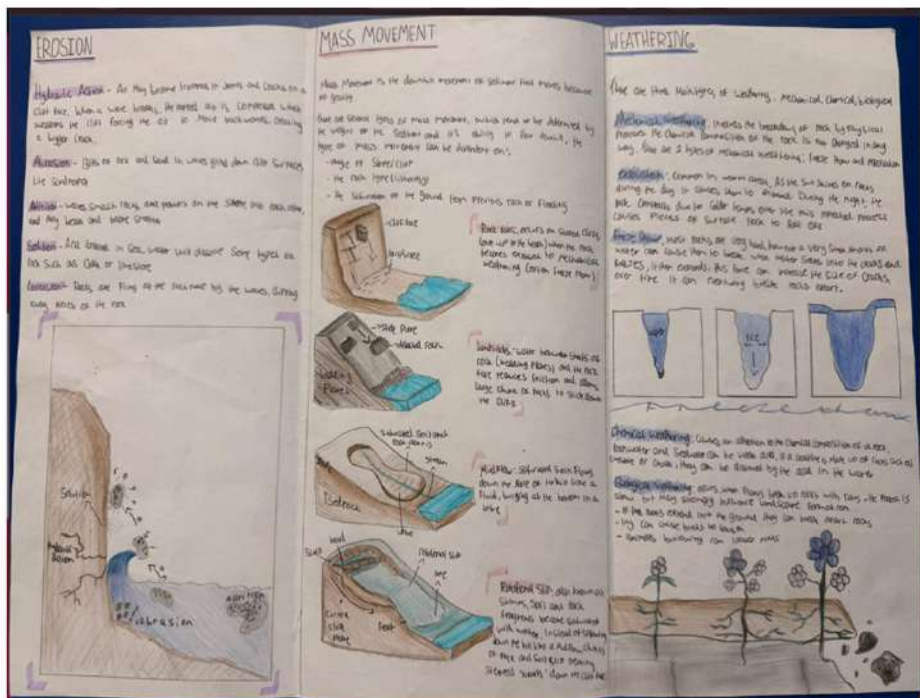

A huge thank you to Aysha Kent, Education and Future Workforce Manager, for organising such a valuable experience and for her continued support of our school's careers programme.



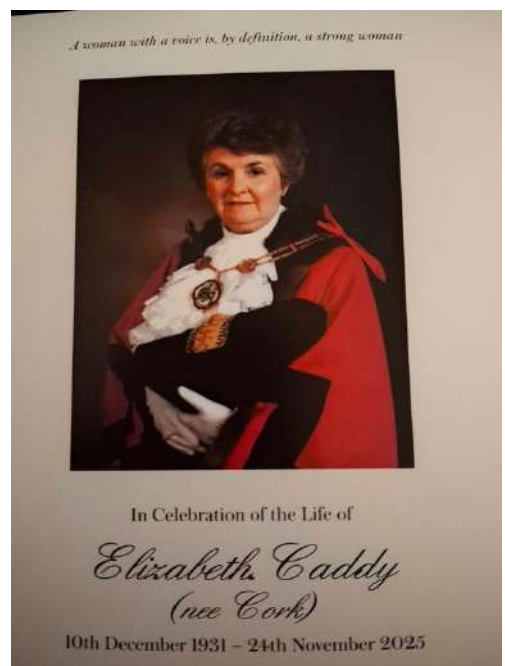

## What is a Work Shadowing Day?

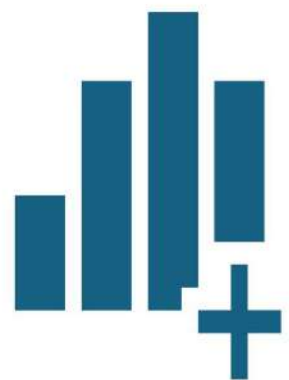
- A chance to spend a day in a real workplace!

# CCSC UNIFORM POLICY

### Blazers

# Science

Science can be defined as a discipline that builds and organises knowledge in the form of testable hypotheses and predictions about the universe. Put more simply, Science is studying the world through observation, experiments and evidence. It is a way of learning about the world by asking questions and testing ideas. This is known as the scientific method. A simple example of this method in action may be to ask 'Do plants need water to grow?' This could be tested by putting two identical plants in pots, watering only one and then comparing the results. Only the watered plant grows, providing evidence of plants' need for water.

## Branches of Science

Science can be divided into several main branches: Natural sciences are what we tend to think of as science, particularly in an educational setting (shown right), but that is just one branch of four. The others are social sciences including psychology and sociology, formal sciences such as mathematics and statistics and applied science featuring areas such as engineering and computer science. There is of course some overlap. For example, medicine is classed as an applied science but a strong knowledge of biology and chemistry are essential. Within the 3 natural sciences, there are many subsciences. For example, topics in Biology include zoology, botany, genetics, microbiology, many others. Science is a rich tapestry of many overlapping disciplines.

**CHEMISTRY**  
Chemistry is the branch of science that studies the composition, structure, properties, and changes of matter. It involves the study of elements, compounds, and reactions.

**PHYSICS** @bcsp100  
Physics is the branch of science that deals with matter, energy, force, motion, and the laws governing the universe. It explores concepts like gravity, electromagnetism, and the nature of space and time.

**BIOLOGY**  
Biology is the branch of science that studies living organisms and their life processes. It includes the study of cells, genetics, evolution, and ecosystems.

## 8 Great British Scientists

1. Isaac Newton- discovered gravity and developed the laws of motion, laying the foundation of classical physics.
2. Charles Darwin- developed the theory of evolution by natural selection- the cornerstone of modern biology. Author of 'On The Origin of Species.'
3. Alexander Fleming- discoverer of penicillin, the first widely-used antibiotic, revolutionising the field of medicine and saving countless lives along the way.
4. Michael Faraday- pioneer of electromagnetism, whose discoveries made electric motors and generators possible, shaping the modern world.
5. Rosalind Franklin- played a crucial role in discovering the structure of DNA, allowing understanding of genetics and its many therapeutical applications.
6. Alan Turing- key figure in computer science, whose efforts helped to break the German enigma codes during World War II, a huge contribution to the war effort.
7. Stephen Hawking- best known for groundbreaking research on black holes and cosmology and author of 'A Brief History of Time.'
8. Tim Berners-Lee- inventor of the world wide web, which transformed global communication and the way that information is shared.
